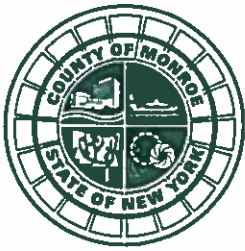

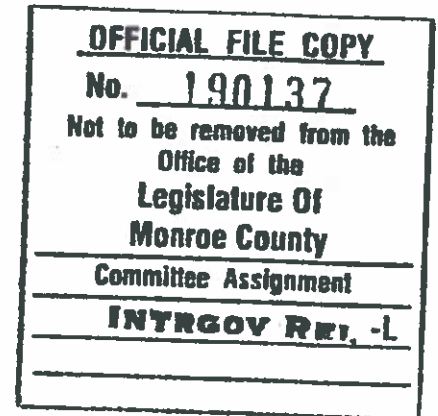

Subject: Authorize an Intermunicipal Agreement with Genesee County for Wholly Exempt Status for Four
Parcels of Land within Monroe County

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize an intermunicipal agreement with Genesee County for wholly exempt status for four (4) parcels of land located in the Towns of Wheatland, Chili and Riga, as required by New York State Real Property Tax Law section 406.

This intermunicipal agreement is required per New York State Real Property Tax Law section 406 to grant exempt status. The properties will be utilized for a new water main project that will serve residents of Genesee County. Sometime after completion of the project, the four (4) parcels will be turned over to the Monroe County Water Authority.

The four (4) parcels to be granted wholly exempt status are: 1104 Main Street, tax account number 208.16-1-36 and 1114 Main Street, tax account number 208.16-1-37 in the Town of Wheatland; 60 Golden Road, tax account number 133.17-1-99 in the Town of Chili and 7090 West Buffalo Road, tax account number 142.04-1-19 in the Town of Riga. Wholly exempt status will begin for the 2019 assessment roll.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute an intermunicipal agreement with Genesee County to allow wholly exempt status for the following four (4) parcels: 1104 Main Street, tax account number 208.16-1-36 and 1114 Main Street, tax account number 208.16-1-37 in the Town of Wheatland; 60 Golden Road, tax account number 133.17-1-99 in the Town of Chili and 7090 West Buffalo Road, tax account number 142.04-1-19 in the Town of Riga, as required by New York State Real Property Tax Law section 406.

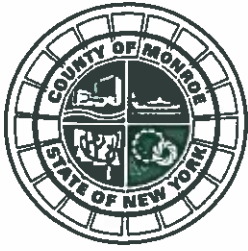
No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

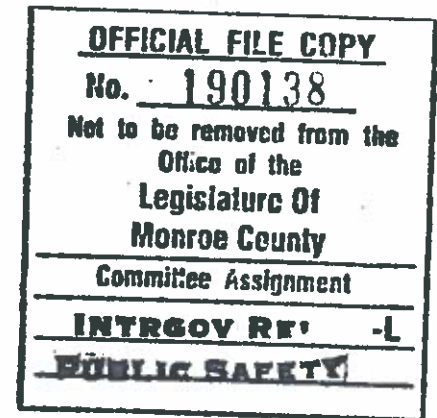

Subject: Authorize Intermunicipal Agreements with the City of Rochester and Monroe County Towns and Villages and Contracts with Eligible Public Safety and Public Service Entities and Various Approved Organizations, with Some Being Charged a Fee, for Access to and Applicable Use of Monroe County's Trunked Radio System and with the City of Rochester and Monroe County Towns and Villages with Police Departments for the Use of End User Radio Equipment

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize intermunicipal agreements with the City of Rochester and Monroe County towns and villages and contracts with eligible public safety and public service entities and various approved organizations, with some being charged a fee, for access to and applicable use of Monroe County's trunked radio system and with the City of Rochester and Monroe County towns and villages with police departments for use of end user radio equipment for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2024, with the option to renew for two (2) additional five-year terms or until either party cancels the agreement.

This agreement allows public safety and public service users to have access to and use of Monroe County's digital, 700/800 MHz trunked radio system. Eventually, Monroe County plans to migrate all first responders and various public service entities to one integrated system, creating ease of communications interoperability and alleviate Monroe County's need to maintain disparate systems for each discipline.


The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute intermunicipal agreements, and any amendments thereto, with the City of Rochester and Monroe County towns and villages and contracts with eligible public safety and public service entities and various approved organizations, with some being charged a fee, for access to and applicable use of Monroe County's trunked radio system and with the City of Rochester and Monroe County towns and villages with police departments for use of end user radio equipment, for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2024, with the option to renew for two (2) additional five-year terms or until either party cancels the agreement.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

Some agreements will be revenue generating and no additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.
