Subject: Approval of Monroe Community College's 2012-2013 Operating Budget

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body approve the operating budget of Monroe Community College for the fiscal year September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013 as submitted by the College.

The proposed 2012-2013 Monroe Community College budget has been reviewed by me, as well as the staff of the County's Office of Management and Budget. I concur with the request of the College.

The following resolution was adopted by the Monroe Community College Board of Trustees at their meeting on June 4, 2012:

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of Monroe Community College approves the Operating Budget for the fiscal year September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013, in the amount of \$122,309,000.

Approval of this budget will provide funding for 14,800 state-aidable full-time equivalent students during the college fiscal year. Adoption by Your Honorable Body is required before the State University of New York can approve its share of the College budget.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- Schedule and hold a public hearing.
- 2. Approve the total Monroe Community College operating budget in the amount of \$122,309,000, and a sponsor contribution by the County of Monroe in the amount of \$18,380,000.

The approval of this budget will require an appropriation of \$18,380,000 in the County of Monroe budget year 2013 as the County sponsor contribution.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

Authorize a Contract with HMS Employer Solutions to Conduct a Dependent Eligibility Audit for Monroe County Employees and Retirees Enrolled in Monroe County Health and/or Dental Insurance

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with HMS Employer Solutions, in an amount not to exceed \$61,580, to conduct a dependent eligibility audit for Monroe County employees and retirees enrolled in Monroe County health and/or dental insurance, for the period of August 1, 2012 through July 31, 2013.

HMS Employer Solutions will conduct a dependent eligibility audit to ensure that only eligible dependents of Monroe County employees and retirees are enrolled in County health and/or dental insurance.

A request for proposals was issued for this contract and HMS Employer Solutions was selected as the most qualified to provide this service.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with HMS Employer Solutions, 355 Quartermaster Court, Jeffersonville, IN 47130, to conduct a dependent eligibility audit for Monroe County employees and retirees enrolled in Monroe County health and/or dental insurance, in an amount not to exceed \$61,580, for the period of August 1, 2012 through July 31, 2013.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2012 Monroe County budget within the benefits appropriations for each department. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.
