Subject: Enact a Local Law to Adopt the Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways Assessment Relief Act in Monroe County

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body enact a Local Law to adopt the Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways Assessment Relief Act in Monroe County.

New York State's Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) offers local governments the option to adopt the Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways Assessment Relief Act. By "opting into" a section of this law, a municipality can provide assessment relief to property owners along Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways who meet certain requirements.

Chapter 85 of the Laws of 2017 of the State of New York allows a municipality to adopt a local law to provide assessment relief impacted by flooding along Lake Ontario and connected waterways. This local law will provide between 15 and 45 percent reduction of the improved assessed value for the calendar year 2017 only.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Enact a Local Law to adopt the Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways Assessment Relief Act in Monroe County as follows:
 - (a) For real property that lost at least ten percent but less than twenty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by fifteen percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;
 - (b) For real property that lost at least twenty percent but less than thirty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by twenty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;
 - (c) For real property that lost at least thirty percent but less than forty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by thirty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;


- (d) For real property that lost at least forty percent but less than fifty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by forty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll.
2. Authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to complete all necessary documents for grant funding in association with the Lake Ontario – St. Lawrence Seaway flood recovery and International Joint Commission Plan Mitigation grant program.
3. Amend the 2017 operating budget to recognize additional erroneous assessment revenue of \$500,000 in general fund 9001, funds center 1209020000, County General, and appropriate such revenue into general fund 9001, funds center 1209020000, County General.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

This local law will equally impact the revenues and expenditures of the current Monroe County budget, and no additional net County support will be required.

I recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

LOCAL LAW NO. _____ OF 2017

**A LOCAL LAW RELATING TO LAKE ONTARIO AND CONNECTED WATERWAYS
ASSESSMENT RELIEF ACT IN MONROE COUNTY**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the authority granted by the Lake Ontario and Connected Waterways Relief Act in Monroe County, real property impacted by flooding located within Monroe County shall be granted assessment relief for the calendar year 2017 as follows:

- (a) For real property that lost at least ten percent but less than twenty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by fifteen percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;
- (b) For real property that lost at least twenty percent but less than thirty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by twenty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;
- (c) For real property that lost at least thirty percent but less than forty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by thirty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;
- (d) For real property that lost at least forty percent but less than fifty percent of its improved value due to flooding, the assessed value attributable to the improvements shall be reduced by forty-five percent for purposes of the participating municipality on the impacted tax roll;

Section 2. Authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to complete all necessary documents for grant funding in association with the Lake Ontario – St. Lawrence Seaway flood recovery and International Joint Commission Plan Mitigation grant program.

Section 3. Amend the 2017 operating budget to recognize additional erroneous assessment revenue of \$500,000 in general fund 9001, funds center 1209020000, County General, and appropriate such revenue into general fund 9001, funds center 1209020000, County General.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

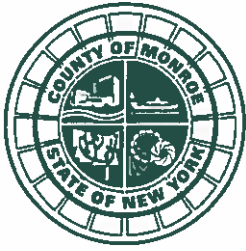



Subject: Authorize an Intermunicipal Agreement with the City of Rochester for Limited Access to the Monroe County Electronic Pistol Permit Records System

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize an intermunicipal agreement with the City of Rochester for limited access to the Monroe County electronic pistol permit records system, for a term of three (3) years upon execution of the agreement, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms.

Monroe County, through the Office of the County Clerk, has under its management and supervision an electronic pistol permit records system. The City of Rochester, through the Rochester Police Department, desires access to the County's system. The County is willing to permit the City limited access to the County's system provided the City assumes all costs, responsibilities and liabilities of access to the County's system.

Rochester City Council authorized this agreement at its July 18, 2017 meeting (Ordinance No. 2017-249).

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute an intermunicipal agreement, and any amendments thereto, with the City of Rochester, for limited access to the Monroe County electronic pistol permit records system, for a term of three (3) years upon execution of the agreement, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

This agreement will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.
