WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Weds., Sept. 30: Floodplain Management & Hazard Mitigation for Local Communities

Topics: Floodplain management strategies and comprehensive planning; managing development in floodplains; using flood studies; administering the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP); case studies; elevation certificates; unnumbered A zones; the Community Rating System; and the Monroe County Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan.

Faculty: Kenneth Avery, PE, Certified Floodplain Manager (CFM), Diplomate Water Resources Engineer (D. WRE), Bergmann Associates; Matt Chapman, Residential Building Inspector, Town of Greece; Paul Czapranski, CFM, Technical Services Coordinator, Town of Greece; and Muffy Meisenzahl, Administrator, Monroe County Office of Emergency Management.

Thurs., October 15: Historic Preservation Planning for Municipalities

Topics: Based on brief, illustrated success stories, this session will highlight ways in which historic preservation tools and strategies can help communities within the following contexts: threatened buildings/crisis situations, quality of life, green building/healthy living, economics, downtown revitalization/community and economic development, and environmental planning.

Faculty: Jayme Breschard, Senior Planner, Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council and Amy Facca, Preservation Planner, Historic Preservation Field Services Bureau/SHPO, NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Thurs., October 22: Moving Toward a Sustainable Built Environment: Green Housing

Topics: Monroe County and the region have a long history of education and use of green initiatives. This workshop will look toward the future as we apply those green initiatives to create sustainable built environments and green housing. The history, benefits and challenges of transitioning to what is now described as conservation and sustainable living environments include energy, maintenance and future cost considerations. The new ANSI National Green Building Standard for Housing will be presented as a helpful tool for builders and communities to work together on improving and sustaining built environments, starting with development of the land. Discussion will also include evolving State incentives for energy reduction and the importance of addressing sustainability of existing housing, which is aging.
