ANNUAL SPRING FLOWER SHOW OPENS AT HIGHLAND PARK'S LAMBERTON CONSERVATORY

Easter Lilies, Daffodils and Tulips headline the 2008 exhibition

County Executive **Maggie Brooks** today announced the opening of the 2008 Spring Flower Show at Monroe County's Lambertton Conservatory. This seasonal horticultural exhibit is a popular annual tradition at Highland Park.

"Monroe County's residents and visitors don't need to wait for April showers to bring May flowers," said Brooks. "Spring has arrived in an eye-catching colorful display at the Lambertton Conservatory. If you are longing for the sights and smells of spring, you will surely enjoy this wonderful exhibit!"

True seasonal favorites, 200 Easter Lilies dominate the Spring Flower Show, both visually and aromatically. Also anchoring the exhibit are hundreds of forced bulbs, including daffodils and tulips.

Rounding out the Conservatory's spring display are 150 Obconica Primroses, 150 Kalanchoes, and many Hyacinths, Hydrangeas and Azaleas.

The Lambertton Conservatory is located in Monroe County's Highland Park at 180 Reservoir Avenue and is open daily from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. (including Easter Sunday).

Admission is, as follows: **Adults** are \$2.00 per person; **Seniors** (ages 62 and up) are \$1.00 per person; **Youth** (ages 6 through 18) are \$1.00 per person; and, supervised **Children** (through age 5) are FREE.
