BROOKS HOSTS 3RD VIRTUAL TOWN HALL MEETING

Continues to Engage Community to Solve Resource Gap

Monroe County Executive Maggie Brooks will host her third Virtual Town Hall Meeting to seek input from taxpayers in an effort to address the significant financial resource gap facing the community.

“Tonight we will host our third Virtual Town Hall Meeting in this series as we continue to seek input from Monroe County residents to help close a \$29 Million gap in community resources,” said **Brooks**. *“We are collecting valuable opinions and ideas from all participants and urge residents to take part in the meetings as they receive our telephone calls.”*

The Virtual Town Hall Meeting is exciting new technology that was created to allow elected officials to have discussions with large constituencies. To date, 15,064 Monroe County residents have participated in this series of Virtual Town Hall Meetings.

“Government can not solve this budget crisis alone. That is why we need the help of our residents,” said **Brooks**. *“We must work together, as an entire community, to come up with a permanent budget solution in order to continue to make Monroe County a great place to live, work and raise a family.”*

Brooks also launched a new section of the Monroe County website, monroecounty.gov, where residents can take a budget survey and submit unique ideas for streamlining government services and finding new revenue sources.

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
