**AUTHORIZING CONTRACT WITH CRANE-HOGAN STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS, INC. FOR
CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR NORTHWEST QUADRANT WATER RESOURCE
RECOVERY FACILITY PRIMARY CLARIFIER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PURE WATERS ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF THE
NORTHWEST QUADRANT PURE WATERS DISTRICT, as follows:

Section 1. The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc., in the amount of \$708,000, for construction services for the Northwest Quadrant Pure Waters District's Northwest Quadrant Water Resource Recovery Facility Primary Clarifier Improvements Project, and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

Section 2. Funding for this project, consistent with authorized uses, is included in capital fund 1924 and any capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect in accordance with Section C2-7 of the Monroe County Charter.

Subject: Authorize a Contract with Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc. for Construction Services for the Northwest Quadrant Water Resource Recovery Facility Primary Clarifier Improvements Project

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that the Administrative Board of the Northwest Quadrant Pure Waters District authorize a contract with Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc., in the amount of \$708,000, for construction services for the Northwest Quadrant Water Resource Recovery Facility (NWQ WRRF) Primary Clarifier Improvements Project.

The District owns, operates and maintains the NWQ WRRF located at 170 Payne Beach Road in the Town of Greece. The NWQ WRRF contains two (2) separate primary clarifier tanks. The primary clarifiers' mechanisms, bridges and walkways have served their useful life and are in need of replacement to ensure continuity of service to the District customers. The improvements will include the replacement of the clarifier mechanism, center drive mechanism and controls, and the bridge and walkways.

The following bids were received:

Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc.	\$ 708,000
C.P. Ward, Inc.	751,949
Blue Heron Construction Company, LLC	755,611
John W. Danforth Company	823,900
Villager Construction, Inc.	847,000

The bids have been reviewed and the Department of Environmental Services recommends the general construction contract award to Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc. in the amount of \$708,000 for construction services as the lowest responsible bidder.

The specific Administrative Board action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract with Crane-Hogan Structural Systems, Inc., 3001 Brockport Road, Spencerport, New York 14559, in the amount of \$708,000, for construction services for the Northwest Quadrant Pure Waters District's Northwest Quadrant Water Resource Recovery Facility Primary Clarifier Improvements Project, and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

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
