



The Monroe County Legislature has reviewed and considered the Short Environmental Assessment Form dated September 3, 2024, and has considered the potential environmental impacts of the acquisition of interests of real property located in the Town of Mendon pursuant to the requirements of State Environmental Quality Review Act and has found that the proposed action will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts. The Monroe County Legislature hereby issues and adopts the Negative Declaration attached hereto and made a part hereof and determines that an environmental impact statement is not required.
Section 3. The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to take such actions to comply with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, including without limitation, the execution of documents and the filing, distribution, and publication of the documents required under the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and any other actions to implement the intent of this resolution.
Section 4. This resolution shall take effect in accordance with Section C2-7 of the Monroe County Charter.
