

The Monroe County Department of Transportation has identified the need to relocate a section of watermain just east of Bard Lane. After discussions with the Monroe County Water Authority, the optimal location for the relocated watermain has been determined to be 10 feet north of the existing sanitary sewer. This change necessitates a revision to Map 60. While a 1,050-square-foot easement area was previously acquired under Resolution 362 of 2023, the relocation will require the acquisition of an additional 1,113 square feet of easement area

The acquisition of easements for Calkins Road Highway Improvement Project in the Town of Henrietta has been preliminarily classified as an Unlisted Action. The SEQRA regulations found at 6 NYCRR Part 617 requires that no agency shall carry out or approve an Action until it has complied with the requirements of SEQRA.


