Subject: Authorize Intermunicipal Agreements with Ten Municipalities for the STOP-DWI Law

**Enforcement Program** 

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize intermunicipal agreements with the ten municipalities within Monroe County that have local police departments for the STOP-DWI Law Enforcement Program in the total amount of \$111,911 for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025.

These agreements will reimburse local police departments for enforcement efforts during 2025. The funding formula includes a base allocation of \$3,000 per police department, plus a percentage of the remaining funding derived from the 2023 DWI arrest totals of each law enforcement agency. Additional funding for Victim Impact Panel ("VIP") responsibilities is allocated to reimburse each participating law enforcement agency for security and general support, and is derived from fees paid by offenders to attend the panel.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute intermunicipal agreements, and any amendments thereto, with the City of Rochester and the nine towns and villages listed below, for the STOP-DWI Law Enforcement Program, in the total amount of \$111,911, for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025:
