### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 170 of 2012 to accept additional funding from the New York State Department of Health, in the amount of \$1,082,944, to support the Monroe County Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) Program, and to extend the time period for two (2) years, through September 30, 2018.

The purpose of this grant is to provide support of the County's existing Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) program. The NFP program is an evidence-based nurse home visiting program that has been rigorously evaluated and includes expertly trained nurses delivering the services per a standard curriculum. The grant provides home visits to approximately 289 high-risk, first time mothers, their infants and families to improve their pregnancy outcomes and their health, well-being and self-sufficiency. This additional funding will be used to support program related expenses, including partial funding for existing positions, administrative support, training, printing, contracts and supplies. The additional funding will bring the grant total to \$3,790,304.

- 1. Amend Resolution 170 of 2012 to accept an additional \$1,082,944 from, and to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Department of Health, for support of the Nurse-Family Partnership Program, bringing the total program award to \$3,790,304, and to extend the time period for two (2) years, through September 30, 2018.
- Amend the 2016 operating grant budget of the Department of Public Health by appropriating the sum of \$541,472 into fund 9300, funds center 5803050000, Nurse-Family Partnership.

3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

This grant is 100% funded by the New York State Department of Health. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

#### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 180 of 2014 to accept additional funding from the New York State Department of Health, in the amount of \$382,714 and to extend the time period for two (2) years through September 30, 2018 and amend Resolution 399 of 2015 to increase the contract with Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc., from an amount not to exceed \$840,983 to an amount not to exceed \$949,732 for the period of January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016, to support the Monroe County Nurse-Family Partnership Program (NFP).

The purpose of this grant is to provide support of the County's existing NFP program. The NFP program is an evidence-based nurse home visiting program that has been rigorously evaluated and includes expertly trained nurses delivering the services per a standard curriculum. The grant provides a portion of the funding for the NFP program, annually providing home visits to approximately 289 high-risk, first time mothers, their infants and families to improve their pregnancy outcomes and their health, well-being and self-sufficiency. This additional funding will be used to support other program related expenses, including partial funding for existing positions, administrative support, training, printing and supplies. The additional funding will bring the grant total to \$956,785.

Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. provides the nurses who make home visits to all NFP clients and administrative support in arranging for travel, accommodations and training for the program.

A request for qualifications was issued with Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. the sole responder.

#### The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Amend Resolution 180 of 2014 to accept an additional \$382,714 from, and to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Department of Health, to support the Monroe County Nurse-Family Partnership Program, bringing the total program award to \$956,785, and to extend the time period for two (2) years, through September 30, 2018.

- Amend the 2016 operating grant budget of the Department of Public Health by appropriating the sum of \$191,357 into fund 9300, funds center 5803050000, Nurse-Family Partnership.
- Amend Resolution 399 of 2015 to amend the contract with Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc., 2180 Empire Boulevard, Webster, New York, 14580, from an amount not to exceed \$840,983 to an amount not to exceed \$949,732, for the Nurse-Family Partnership Program, for the period of January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

This grant is 100% funded by the New York State Department of Health. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. is a not-for-profit entity, and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that it does not owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.

#### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 393 of 2015 to accept additional funding from the New York State Department of Health, in the amount of \$710,903, to support the Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) Program, and to extend the time period for eighteen (18) months, through September 30, 2018.

This grant provides Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds for the County's existing NFP program. The NFP program is an evidence-based nurse home visiting program that has been rigorously evaluated and includes expertly trained nurses delivering the services per a standard curriculum. The NFP program annually provides home visits to approximately 289 high-risk, first time mothers, their infants and families to improve their pregnancy outcomes and their health, well-being, and self-sufficiency through an existing contract with Visiting Nurse Service of Rochester and Monroe County, Inc. NFP nurses will also provide home visits to approximately 57 TANF recipients who meet the same program criteria. This additional funding will be used to support the current program. The additional funding will bring the grant total to \$2.396,656.

- 1. Amend Resolution 393 of 2015 to accept an additional \$710,903 from, and to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Department of Health, for support of the Nurse-Family Partnership Program, bringing the total program award to \$2,396,656, and to extend the time period for eighteen (18) months, through September 30, 2018.
- Amend the 2016 operating grant budget of the Department of Public Health by appropriating the sum of \$135,800 into fund 9300, funds center 5803050000, Nurse-Family Partnership.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

Partial funding for this grant is included in the 2016 operating grant budget of the Department of Public Health, fund 9300, funds center 5803050000, Nurse Family Partnership. The appropriated amount will adjust the current annual funding to that established by the grant.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 395 of 2015 to accept additional funding from the New York State Department of Health, in the amount of \$10,845, for the Comprehensive HIV/STI/Hepatitis C Prevention, Particularly in Communities of Color Program, for the period of December 1, 2015 through November 30, 2016.

The purpose of this grant is to provide targeted outreach activities to heterosexual individuals in areas with high rates of sexually transmitted infections (STIs), HIV and Hepatitis C. This additional funding will be used to purchase equipment, medical supplies, and bus passes for clients. The additional funding will bring the grant total to \$224,100.

## The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Surveillance Program

### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Department of Health, in the amount of \$400,000, for the HIV Surveillance Program, for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2020.

The purpose of this grant is to fund medical record reviews of potential HIV/AIDS cases. These reviews will provide better data to the State on HIV risk factors and the progression of the disease. The grant will be used for a Public Health Nurse who will conduct the reviews. This will be the ninth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding level is the same amount as the previous 12 month period.

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to accept a \$400,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Department of Health, for the HIV Surveillance Program, for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2020.
- 2. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

Funding for this grant is included in the 2016 operating budget of the Department of Public Health, fund 9001, funds center 5802040300, HIV Surveillance Program.

This grant is 100% funded by the New York State Department of Health. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget. Funding for subsequent years of this grant will be included in future years' budgets.
