

Pavement Management Study Project

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with CHA Consulting, Inc. in the amount of \$318,300 for design services for the Airport Pavement Management Study Project.

A pavement management study provides a consistent, objective, and systematic procedure for establishing facility policies, setting priorities and schedules, allocating resources, and budgeting for pavement maintenance and rehabilitation. A pavement management study not only evaluates the present condition of a pavement, but also predicts its future conditions through the use of pavement condition indicators. The project includes updates to the pavement network definition, updates to the associated mapping and pavement management database, and a visual evaluation of the pavement condition. In addition, the Engineered Materials Arresting Systems ("EMAS") will be evaluated and a maintenance recommendation for the Runway 10-28 EMAS bed will be provided.

This project will be funded by a Federal Aviation Administration grant of 90%, a New York State Department of Transportation grant of 5%, and a local share of 5%.

The Department of Aviation recommends authorization of a contract with CHA Consulting, Inc., a designated airport consultant per Resolution 365 of 2023, to provide design services for the Airport Pavement Management Study Project in the amount of \$318,300.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract with CHA Consulting, Inc., 16 Main Street West, Suite 830, Rochester, New York 14614, for design services for the Airport Pavement Management Study Project in the amount of \$318,300, along with any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

This action is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR§ 617.5(c)(24) ("information collection including basic data collection and research, water quality and pollution studies, traffic counts, engineering studies, surveys, subsurface investigations and soils studies that do not commit the agency to undertake, fund or approve any Type I or Unlisted action") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract, consistent with authorized uses, is included in capital fund 2101 and any capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose. The local funding for this project will ultimately be provided by the Monroe County Airport Authority from Airport generated revenues. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

The records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that neither CHA Consulting, Inc., nor any of its principal officers, owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes. The principal officers of the firm are:

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Passero Associates, Engineering, Architecture & Surveying, P.C. in the amount of \$187,900 for design services for the Parking Facility Upgrades Project at the Frederick Douglass-Greater Rochester International Airport.

This project will upgrade the existing airport employee parking lot by expanding it with approximately 27,300 square feet of new asphalt pavement as well as reconstructing approximately 30,100 square feet of existing asphalt pavement that is in poor condition. Lighting upgrades and the addition of security cameras will also be provided throughout the new and reconstructed areas. During the design phase of the project, approximately 450,000 square feet of existing pavement within the circulation loop will be evaluated to determine additional areas of pavement rehabilitation and/or expansion.

The Department of Aviation recommends authorization of a contract with Passero Associates, Engineering, Architecture & Surveying, P.C., a designated airport consultant per Resolution 365 of 2023, to provide design services for the Parking Facility Upgrades Project in the amount of \$187,900.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract with Passero Associates, Engineering, Architecture & Surveying, P.C., 242 West Main Street, Suite 100, Rochester, New York 14614, for design services for the Parking Facility Upgrades Project at the Frederick Douglass-Greater Rochester International Airport in the amount of \$187,900, along with any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

This action is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c) (1) ("maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in capital fund 1870 and any capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose. I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program, the 2024 Capital Budget, and Bond Resolution 429 of 2023 to expand the scope of the project from "Viaduct Rehabilitation" to "Viaduct and Bridge Rehabilitation;" increase the project authorization in the amount of \$5,000,000; and authorize a contract with C&S Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$361,813 for design services for the project.

The original project was created for the continued rehabilitation of the viaduct at the Airport, which is the elevated roadway that transverses the front of the passenger terminal. This project has expanded to also include the terminal entrance roadway bridge over Brooks Avenue due to a recent inspection by the New York State Department of Transportation. A conditions assessment for both structures was performed in July 2024 which recommended a more indepth structural analysis and expanded scope of work. The original project financing did not include funding for the maintenance of the entrance roadway bridge or the expanded scope of work for the viaduct.

This project will be funded by a Federal Aviation Administration grant of 90%, a New York State Department of Transportation grant of 5%, and a local share of 5%.

The Department of Aviation recommends authorization of a contract with C&S Engineers, Inc., a designated airport consultant per Resolution 365 of 2023, to provide design services for the Viaduct and Bridge Rehabilitation Project in the amount of \$361,813.

This project is scheduled to be considered by the Monroe County Planning Board on September 26, 2024.

### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 280 of 2023 to increase the grant award from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation ("NYSDEC") for Climate Smart Communities for the Climate Vulnerability Assessment from the amount of \$75,000 to the amount of \$150,000 and for the Climate Adaptation Plan from the amount of \$100,000 to the amount of \$200,000, and authorize a contract with T.Y. Lin International Engineering & Architecture, P.C. ("TYLin"), in the amount of \$370,000, for professional design services for the Monroe County Climate Adaptation and Resiliency Plan ("CARP").

Monroe County has long been a leader in innovative sustainability policy that has been both environmentally friendly and cost effective. On September 13, 2022, Your Honorable Body adopted the Climate Action Plan Phase I (Resolution No. 276 of 2022), which focused on reducing greenhouse gas emissions from internal Monroe County government operations, and on August 13, 2024 adopted the Climate Action Plan Phase II (Resolution No. 231 of 2024), which was directed towards supporting the local community in their climate mitigation efforts. By Resolution 280 of 2023, Your Honorable Body solidified the County's commitment to climate initiatives by accepting grants from NYSDEC for Climate Smart Communities for Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Climate Adaptation Plan.

While the intention of the Climate Action Plan is to limit the conditions for future climate change, the next step is to address the impacts to our community. The CARP will identify, analyze, and prioritize the effects of climate hazards and risks (such as flooding, power outages, heat stress and drought), on critical infrastructure, specific population segments, geographic areas, and assets.

In order to retain a consultant to undertake the CARP, this action will increase the Climate Smart Communities grant awards from the NYSDEC to an amount of \$150,000 (previously \$75,000) for the Climate Vulnerability Assessment grant and \$200,000 (previously \$100,000) for the Climate Adaptation Plan grant. The additional grant funds will be used to expand public participation and further develop the resilience planning for both physical and socioeconomic infrastructure with consideration of several climate scenarios with more nuance and specificity. The total project authorization will be \$700,000, with a grant amount of \$350,000 and a matching fund amount of \$350,000 under the County's Climate Initiatives.

The Monroe County Department of Environmental Services will lead the project funded by this grant and administer the grant requirements.

Several consultants were considered to provide professional design services for the CARP, with T.Y. Lin International Engineering & Architecture, P.C rated as the most qualified to provide these services.

#### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a lease agreement with the Monroe County Soil and Water Conservation District ("MCSWCD") to continue to lease office space located at the Monroe County Fleet Center, Building 5, 145 Paul Road for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms; and authorize a contract with the MCSWCD, in an amount not to exceed \$65,000 for stormwater management consulting services for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms.

Per Resolutions 270 of 2012, 237 of 2014, 109 of 2015, and 153 of 2020, Your Honorable Body previously authorized a lease agreement with the MCSWCD to locate their offices at the Monroe County Fleet Center, Building 5, 145 Paul Road. Per Resolutions 97 and 98 of 2011, 109 of 2015, and 153 of 2020, Your Honorable Body previously authorized contracts with the MCSWCD to provide services related to stormwater management.

The MCSWCD will provide stormwater management consulting services for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 for a total cost of \$65,000. The Stormwater Coalition of Monroe County will provide the funding for this contract to support stormwater mitigation activities conducted by its municipal members. The Stormwater Coalition of Monroe County established funding authorization as part of the annual budget process.

The MCSWCD will compensate the County with additional services in lieu of rent equivalent to the market-value annual rent of \$20,000. The term of the lease will be concurrent with the stormwater management consulting contract with the MCSWCD and contain a 30-day termination clause. The lease may be renewed up to four (4) additional one-year terms when a stormwater management consulting contract is executed.

#### The specific legislative actions required are:

Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a lease agreement, and any amendments thereto, with the Monroe County Soil and Water Conservation District to lease office space at the Monroe County Fleet Center, Building 5, 145 Paul Road for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms.

### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program and the 2024 Capital Budget to add a project entitled "MCC Downtown Campus Career Center" in the amount of \$14,500,000 and authorize financing for the project in the amount of \$14,500,000.

This project intends to leverage the strengths of the many organizations within Monroe County's workforce system, such as the NYS Department of Labor that has expressed an interest in co-locating its primary career center alongside RochesterWorks, Inc., which will lead to better outcomes for those seeking employment pathways. Monroe Community College and its partners seek to make the workforce development system more efficient and manageable for prospective workers and employers alike. By strategically co-locating not just agencies providing workforce development programming, but also those coordinating and administering supportive services, this project aims to focus and enhance the community's efforts to remove barriers to employment. Often, a working-age individual confronts multiple obstacles to employment, both those that are systemic within their community, as well as those rooted in one's personal life. By improving access and directly linking workforce development and supportive service providers, this project will enhance, for many, the ability to navigate a career pathway.

The proposed co-location at the MCC Downtown Campus would remove a logistical barrier often felt by workforce program participants who often do not see education or training programs as feasible. This location would also provide a better, more centralized pathway to the growing number of certificate programs being offered by MCC, tailored to industry need.

Funding for the project has been identified as being provided by: Congressional Appropriation Bill for \$1,600,000; Ralph C. Wilson Foundation and Konar Foundation for \$1,500,000 combined; the New York State Empire State Development's Fund for \$5,500,000; and equal match funding through the State University of New York for \$2,950,000; and Monroe County for \$2,950,000; for total project funding of \$14,500,000.

This project will be considered by the Monroe County Planning Board on October 24, 2024.
