Members of the Commission asked many questions about the redistricting plan, the maps and the process. After all questions were answered and Commission members were able to comment on the plan, Chairman Carbone asked for a roll call vote.

Legislator Brew MOVED and Ms. Nicolay SECONDED a motion to present the proposed redistricting local law to the full legislature. A vote was taken and was approved 3-2. The ayes were Mr. Brew, Ms. Nicolay and Chairman Carbone. The noes were Mr. Bauroth and Ms. Ortiz.

Speaking on behalf of the League of Women Voters of the Rochester Metropolitan Area, I submit the following remarks:

- 1. The conduct of this commission and especially of its chair makes a mockery of the state Open Meeting Law. This comment applies to the failed meeting of Nov. 12, the special meeting of the County Leg on Nov. 23 and the failure of public notice for today's meeting. We learned about this meeting via social media, but as of midnight, it was not announced on the County website. There is no excuse for such late notice to the public.
- 2. On October 13, we urged you to conduct the business of the Commission in an open and transparent manner with ample meetings for the Commission to do its work together and under the public eye. That has not happened. The Commission has not held a single meeting since Oct. 15. If the Commission is not meeting, then the Commission is not performing its duties. The Commission is required by law to contain five members, including both Republicans and Democrats, and it is the Commission which is required to prepare proposed districts to submit to the Legislature. If the Commission never meets, then it is not in compliance with the County Charter, and any maps that may be proposed can hardly meet the requirements of the charter. Such non-activity on the part of the Commission may well be grounds for legally contesting the maps.
- 3. We would like to know the full details of the "Fusco Law Office," which Legislator Carbone, individually and without the knowledge or consent of the Commission, has retained to advise the Commission. President Carbone touted this firm at last week's County Leg meeting as highly qualified, but we have been unable through internet searches to learn what Law Office he was referring to. What is the name of the attorney, what law firm is he associated with and what NY counties has he advised regarding reapportionment? Please provide the name, address, website and phone number for the attorney in question.
- 4. We urge you again, as we did in our testimony to you on October 13, to allow sufficient time for public input. We believe that 3-4 weeks is the minimum time required for informed public feedback on the maps. Furthermore, after the public hearing, there should be time for the Commission to make adjustments in response to that feedback. We see that per the County Charter, once the Commission has submitted the maps to the Legislature, its work is done. However, the Commission is free to schedule public hearings in advance of submitting the maps to the Legislature, as you did in

October. We believe that you are not doing your job if you do not allow time to study public comment and allow time to revise the proposed maps in response thereto.

We residents of Monroe County will live with these maps for ten years and we deserve the time to examine and discuss them. There is no reason that maps must be approved before the end of the year, and that cannot serve as a pretext for avoiding public scrutiny.

l urge Mr. Carbone as head of the Commission and President of the County Legislature to change course and conduct all future Commission and Legislature meetings and actions according to standard procedures, giving adequate notice (time and methods) to commissioners and the public, providing an adequate period for public review of proposed maps, and allowing for revisions to maps based on public feedback prior to a final vote by the legislature.

The end product of your process will provide the final measure of the Commission's work. Maps that are fair, that respect and provide voice for neighborhoods and diverse communities will redeem the flawed process. The converse may well lead to court or referendum challenges.

Resolution Enacting a Local Law Entitled "Amending Monroe County Charter and Administrative Code Relating to Legislative Redistricting and Term of Office of Members of County Legislature"

WHEREAS, the Bureau of the Census released the enumeration of the population of the United States of America on August 12th, 2021, and

WHEREAS, this the Legislature of the County of Monroe, State of New York is required to apply the results of the decennial census in apportioning the populations of the several legislative districts of the County of Monroe, and

WHEREAS, the Legislative District Revision Commission of the County of Monroe has met and has recommended a plan of apportionment reflecting the population totals set forth in the 2020 decennial census, and

WHEREAS, on October 27th, the Governor signed into law Chapter 516 of the New York Laws of 2021, which provides that no county shall supersede any state law which relates to the division of any county into districts for the purpose of apportionment, thereby applicable to this apportionment, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the County of Monroe seeks to adopt a plan of apportionment distributing the population of Monroe County among the legislative districts within the strictures of the law so as to assure the citizens of Monroe County equal representation in accordance with the principal of "one person one vote", now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

- Section 1. Section A4-4 of the Administrative Code of Monroe County is hereby repealed and a new §A4-4 is enacted in place thereof, to read as follows:
 - B. In the description of the districts set forth below, all references to towns apply to that territory wholly contained in each of the towns in the County as previously bounded and described by Local Law No. 7 of 2011. Section 2. Section C2-12C(1) of the Monroe County Charter is amended by deleting "10%" from the last line and inserting "five (5) percent".

The map of the twenty-nine (29) legislative districts (and the accompanying maps of the individual districts) annexed and incorporated herein shall be the plan for the apportionment of the legislative districts comprising the Monroe County Legislature, applicable in the next General Election held for the public offices of Member of the Monroe County Legislature (one member to be elected from each district), and each election held thereafter.

Section 4. The twenty-nine (29) legislative districts as previously bounded and described by Local Law No. 7 of 2011 shall continue as such for the limited purpose of continuing in office the legislators presently elected from said districts and shall cease to exist as such on December 31, 2023.
