### **BROOKS: 9,402 RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN SECOND F.A.I.R. VIRTUAL TOWN HALL**

Building on the success of last week's inaugural Virtual Town Hall, County Executive Maggie Brooks announced today that 9,402 County residents participated in last evening's community dialogue on her F.A.I.R. plan to end the County's budget crisis. Setting a new record for attendance at a local town hall meeting, last night's participation in the forum exceeded the total of last week's inaugural Virtual Town Hall by 1,177.

Combining the attendance from the first two forums, 17,627 Monroe County residents have taken the time to participate in this important community dialogue; a figure greater than the seating capacity of Frontier Field.

*"9,402 Monroe County residents chose to ask a question, or listen to our community dialogue last night on my F.A.I.R. Plan to end the budget crisis while cutting the property tax rate with no cuts in quality-of-life services," Brooks stated. "Through this important community dialogue, which will continue through the coming weeks, we will visit every local neighborhood and ensure that our friends and neighbors understand why my F.A.I.R. plan is the best course for our community to achieve true fiscal stability."*

The Virtual Town Hall Meeting is an exciting new technology that was created to allow elected officials to have discussions with large constituencies. Maggie Brooks' **F.A.I.R. Plan** (**F**airness, **A**ccountability, **I**nnovation and **R**esults) solves Monroe County's structural deficit for the long-term, with no fiscal impact to the City of Rochester, towns and villages. The F.A.I.R. Plan cuts the tax rate of every property taxpayer in Monroe County. The F.A.I.R. Plan also preserves important quality of life services for the residents of our community, including neighborhood police protection, road and bridge repair, and public parks, while ensuring a balanced County budget for years to come.

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## **Virtual Town Hall Meetings**

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### **Background on Maggie Brooks' F.A.I.R. Plan:**

#### **FAIRNESS**

The Plan is **fair to taxpayers**, cutting the Monroe County property tax rate by eleven cents per thousand dollars of assessed value, as a way to reduce the property tax burden. At the same time, the Plan protects and maintains the County's revenue sharing with towns, villages and the City of Rochester at existing "Morin-Ryan" levels.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY**

The Plan allows us to solve the budget crisis, locally. By enacting the Medicaid Swap, enormous Medicaid costs are **permanently eliminated** for Monroe County residents.

#### **INNOVATION**

The Plan **changes the way we pay for local services** in Monroe County. Specifically, the Plan will charge-back the local cost of Monroe Community College to local taxpayers based on student residency. The Plan will also adjust the County vehicle registration fee by \$10 to fund road and bridge repairs throughout our community. Additionally, the Plan will use record increases in state aid to offset a reduction in County sales tax funding to local schools, so that local school districts continue to get at least the same amount of money.

#### **RESULTS**

The Plan **solves** Monroe County's structural budget deficit for the long-term future. The County's projected budget shortfall of \$102 million over the next two years, most of which is attributed to burdensome Medicaid costs, is completely eliminated.
