As an overview, the current permitted landfill can be described by a few key numbers: 855 acres, this is the total property acreage owned by Monroe County and Waste Management of New York, LLC; 98.6 acres, this is the size of the lined disposal area that we refer to as the Permitted Footprint; 1,945 tons per day, which equates to 597,000 tons per year. This is the Permitted Waste Acceptance Rate. In 2018 this is the year that the currently permitted landfill is anticipated to reach capacity under the existing permit.

The Proposed Landfill Expansion proposal involves continuing to operate the Mill Seat Landfill with the future phased construction of an additional 118.3 acres of a double composite liner system immediately



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south of the existing Mill Seat Landfill.

The proposal also involves the addition of ancillary infrastructure, the abandonment of a portion of O'Brien and Brew Roads, a wetland mitigation area located south of Bovee Road in the Town of Riga, and a stream mitigation area in the Village of Churchville.

is important to note that the majority of the operating procedures will remain unchanged. For example, the following components will not change with Proposed Landfill Expansion: Permitted Waste Acceptance Rate will continue to be 1,945 tons per day or 597,000 tons per year. operating equipment and methods will remain the same. The final permitted height of the landfill will not change. Hours of operation will remain the same as they are today. The same types of waste materials will continue to be accepted for disposal. The origin of materials will remain unchanged. And most importantly, we will continue with our strong commitment to protect the environment and to be a good neighbor in this community.



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Now I would like to turn the presentation over to Kevin Voorhees.

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MR. VOORHEES: Thanks, Jeff. And hello everyone. I appreciate you being here. I am Kevin Voorhees from Barton and Loquidice Engineers. As Peg has previously mentioned, we are here tonight to receive your comments on the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement. The Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement, which we refer as the DSEIS, is a multi-chapter and multi-volume document that describes the environmental setting, identifies potentially significant environmental impacts associated with the proposed action, and describes mitigation measures to reduce the significance of those potential impacts.

The proposed action includes an expansion of the Permitted Footprint and associated support facilities. Overall, the proposed landfill expansion is expected to include the phased construction of 118.3 acres of additional double composite lined landfill directly south of the Permitted



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Footprint. It will include an overlay of
39.2 acres on the existing Permitted
Footprint and approximately 30 acres of
disturbance associated with the additional
support facilities for operation of the
Proposed Landfill Expansion. These support
facilities include storm water management
structures, access roads, landfill gas
collection and control infrastructure and
leachate conveyance structure. Other
components of the Proposed Action are final
cover design modifications to the Permitted
Footprint; the proposed wetland impacts and
mitigation; the proposed RG-6 Tail impact and
mitigation; extension of the Landfill Lease
Agreement between the County and Waste
Management of New York; abandonment of a
portion of O'Brien Road, which includes the
O'Brien Road wetland restoration; abandonment
of a portion of Brew Road; County and Town
of Riga approvals of land transfers; and
receipt of noise easements.

The DSEIS is the principal document that describes the technical and environmental



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information related to the proposed site and that assesses potential impacts and mitigation measures associated with the proposed action.

The Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement includes a discussion of the project's background, purpose, public needs and benefits, as well as social and economic This document has been considerations. prepared in accordance with the requirements set forth by the State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations. The State Environmental Quality Review Act is also referred to as SEQRA. Potentially significant environmental impacts associated with the proposed action, which were not addressed in previous SEQRA analyses prepared for the Mill Seat Landfill, are not addressed in this Draft Supplement Environmental Statement. Potential significant impacts and mitigation measures described in the DSEIS include any that may be anticipated within years after final closure of the Proposed Landfill Expansion, which is the minimum post closure monitoring period required by the



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State's solid waste regulations. These State solid waste regulations are referred to as 6 NYCRR Part 360. A public scoping process was previously undertaken for the proposed action in May of 2013, which resulted in a final scoping document that identified the following potential environmental impacts to be addressed in the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement.

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Environmental Impact Statement is prepared and accepted by the County, a Statement of Findings will be prepared that relies upon information contained in the Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement. This SEQRA Statement of Findings will balance environmental, social and economic considerations with regard to the proposed action. The adoption of a Statement of Findings will represent the County's final step in the SEQRA process for the proposed action.

In addition to its completion of the SEQRA process, the County will need to obtain permits from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and the United States Army Corps of Engineers before it can proceed with the proposed action.
