Welcome, Introduction and Announcements (Co-Chair O'Connor):

Meeting called to order at 3:35 P.M. by Co-Chair O'Connor.

Approval of Minutes (Co-Chair Yudelson):

Legislative Update (Legislators Yudelson, Delehanty and Milne):

Tomorrow: lighting project up for approval as part of the \$1M allocation

Circularity 2023 Briefing (Walker)

- International conference on the circular economy reduce reuse recycle repair refurbish, recycling; Seattle hosted this year
- Global circularity dropped from 2018-2023 from 9.1% to 7.2%
- Work needed on supply chains, waste in manufacturing, new business models that include environmental & economic justice; 2nd & 3rd uses/right to repair legislation; extended producer responsibility and tracking & traceability technology track the supplier to the waste stream and how we get where we need to be
- Program highlights included:
 - Dynamic green purchasing
 - o Materials marketplace of online exchange for reuse implemented in Austin, Seattle, and more;
 - Textile policy/textile end of life
 - Deconstruction: Seattle has a new deconstruction employee full time and a requirement to deconstruct and reuse construction & demolition materials; San Antonio, TX has a very progressive deconstructive policy

<u>Climate Action Plan Phase II Update (Presentations by Molly Gaudioso (Bergmann) and Josh Bartlett (Anchor QEA),</u> <u>followed by discussion):</u>

1. Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Inventory Data

Phase II Emissions Inventory covering Scope 3 community emissions preliminary results were shared.

Scope 3 Major Sources:

- Energy Electricity Use, by sector; Fuel Combustion, by sector; Electricity Production; Transmission and Distribution
- Transportation Cars and Trucks; Employee Commutes; Rail, Air, Marine; Off-road Equipment
- Water Supply
- Waste Landfill; Recycling/Compost
- Agriculture, Forestry, and Land Use Land Use Changes; Agriculture: Livestock/Fertilizer
- Process and Fugitive HVAC and Refrigeration; Industrial Process Emissions
- Consumption Food, services, construction materials, other goods

Early Results – emissions by sector; Anchor QEA team is entering data into the ICLEI ClearPath model. Source data evaluations are still underway.

Scope 1 and 2 are 45,000 metric tonnes of emissions; Scope 3 is about 4.5 million metric tonnes for the community;

Electric & transportation are huge – breaking down as expected, but caveat that this is still preliminary; Industrial and Agricultural inputs are yet to be added in; still gathering point source data from industrial outputs; Energy will still be a bigger component even when you get the industrial sources included.

Fugitive emissions include nonpoint source emissions or those from leaks, rather than from a point sources. This can include hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs), refrigerants that come out of vehicles' AC, or methane from a landfill gas capture system.

2. Public Workshop #2

Preparations are underway for the July 26 Public Workshop to present findings of the GHG inventory and the goal framework; share what we know and ask for public input on what actions should happen.

12pm virtual presentation and Q&A, and 6pm in-person event at Monroe Community College Brighton Campus. Virtual presentation will be recorded and online engagement will be available after the meeting.

• Interim Public Input Summaries

- o Ideas Wall Summary snapshot documents to compile this information;
- Summarized the information responses from March 15 to June 23 over 694 unique visitors; commenting, liking, replying, etc.; 1900+ visits; 215 comments total
- Comments and replies by category with a column for likes and dislikes; some very engaged people and great ideas/food for thought
- Summaries feature the top 2 "up-voted comments" for each category
- Largest comments 27% on transportation; followed by Buildings/Housing; Engagement across the 6 sectors
 - Benefit to connecting with the County's Active Transportation Plan; one of the largest sectors; very helpful; not a lot of surprises (reducing use of cars for single passengers); improvements from Active Transportation Plan – more biking, etc.
- Composting the primary topic of conversation for reducing food waste sent to landfills
- Goal & Strategy Approach internal discussions began; preliminary thoughts
 - Focus on sectors with direct county actions; include recommendations to support future actions/ partnerships; similar to tiers of actions in Phase I
 - Other guidance: examples of what others are doing successfully; best practices for the public & other organizations; funding opportunities
 - Discussion of looking for outside funding opportunities; economic opportunity is a big part of sustainability too – green economy-based industries and multifaceted benefits
