Thanked Sean Delehanty for his service. Committee will get a new member appointed by the President of the Legislature after new President is selected. Likely to conclude the committee's work in Q1 2024.

Climate Action Plan Phase II Update (Presentation by Molly Gaudioso, Colliers Engineering and Design):

2. GHG Inventory & BAU Forecast

- Scope 3 sources what should the county be focusing on to achieve reduction targets
- 8,374,961 MT CO2e
- 41%Transportation (65% passenger vehicles)
- ~40% when combining Commercial + Industrial + Residential Energy
- BAU Forecast most impact on Transportation, Energy, and process/fugitive emissions sectors impacted by CLCPA
- --- Question about EV charging may move GHG from transportation to electricity use sector; no issue if not double counting
- BAU reduction in Phase II is not making as big an impact (32% instead of about 56% in Phase I)
- Comparison to other communities?
 - . ○ Similar in Erie County
 - o Cuyahoga much smaller (24%) in transportation; 1.24M population (more public transit)
 - Ulster County smaller total C footprint, but much larger per capita (rural) (Question: total VMT – is it more than us because they're very rural)

3. Public Input Summary – Goals Survey Results

- Preliminary draft sent to CAPAC
- Survey responses: 652 to date
 - o Closed survey, gift card winners being selected, sent before Thanksgiving holiday
 - Not as diverse as desired, but will inform future implementation of public engagement
 - $_{\odot}$ Low representation for ages below 25
 - o 84% white; 4.6% black/African American; 3.83% Hispanic/Latinx/Spanish origin
 - Zip codes: responses from almost every zip code in the county, but also some outside the county in the finger lakes area... much higher response rate in the north east of the county
- All feedback included in report sent to committee... overall very supportive, and some feedback on things that we should be keeping an eye on some will inform the upcoming adaptation and resilience planning
- Many comments on other sustainable policies not specifically GHG emissions related. All of these comments to be captured in appendix for possible use in Climate Adaptation and Resilience Plan

- Michael Yudelson will the plan have a ranking of priorities? Clement Chung pointed to Phase I there will be a
 prioritization with cost/time scale/impact; We will need to make clear the priorities may shift over time; range of activities
 with small and large options; we may change priorities when grant opportunities arise, Living document it will change;
 insert some guidance on that
- Final Phase II CAP should reference other plans that intersect, i.e. Plan Forward, Active Transportation Plan, etc.
