Primary Election 2025 Info

- New York State has what are called "Closed" Primary Elections, meaning you must be enrolled within a party to be eligible to vote in their **Primary Election** on **June 24 2025**.
- Your enrolled party must have a primary race in your district (meaning more candidates running for the same office than seats available).
- Early Voting for the Primary Election takes place from June 14 June 22. During Early Voting, voters can vote in person at ANY Polling Location across Monroe County (see full list of locations on the back).
- New Voter Registrations must be received by June 14, and address changes for currently registered voters must be received by June 9.
- Primary races can be very close and are generally lower turnout due to eligibility more than ever, **YOUR VOTE MATTERS!**

The Monroe County Board of Elections is proud to have acquired new voting technology from Election Systems & Software (ES&S). Beginning with the 2025 Primary Election, Monroe County voters will have the privilege of using the state-of-the-art ExpressVote XL machines, which are designed to enhance voter accessibility, security, and efficiency.

The ExpressVote XL machines feature:

- Voter-Verifiable Paper Records: Each voter will see their printed ballot with the summary of their selections, ensuring accuracy, transparency, and continuing the ability to conduct post-election audits.
- Enhanced Accessibility: The machines accommodate all voters through touch screens, as well as optional audio interfaces and compatibility with assistive devices for independent voting.
- Advanced Security Measures: Rigorous security protocols protect against potential threats, ensuring election integrity.

The Board is hosting public demonstrations and training sessions leading up to the 2025 elections. We invite the public to attend these sessions and encourage continued voter participation and engagement.


