Introduction

The Monroe County Assigned Counsel Program marked its twenty-fifth year of operation in all courts within Monroe County. It was also the fourteenth year of operation for the Conflict Defender Office.

The attorneys of the Monroe County Conflict Defender Office represent indigent clients in Family Court, Rochester City Court and appeals where there is a conflict of interest preventing the individual from being represented by the Monroe County Public Defender Office. The Conflict Defender Office, when fully staffed, is made up of nineteen staff members. The Office's thirteen attorneys include the Conflict Defender, seven Family Court attorneys, three attorneys handling misdemeanor cases in Rochester City Court and two appellate attorneys. The Office, when fully staffed, also has five full-time support staff and one part-time position. Three support staff positions and three Family Court attorney positions continue to be filled pursuant to grants from the Office of Indigent Legal Services of New York State (OILS). Outside support services such as investigators and process servers continue to be done on a contract basis.

In 2016, the Conflict Defender Office had a great deal of turn-over in staff. Conflict Defender Charles Noce retired in early October. Mark D. Funk, Esq. was subsequently named Conflict Defender, and started in that position on October 31, 2016. In the Family Court section, four attorneys left the office in 2016. Three attorneys started with the office during the year, resulting in one vacancy at the end of the year. There was turn-over in one City Court attorney position, with a new attorney starting in January. At the end of the year, City Court was fully staffed, as was the appeals section of the office. One support staff person left the office in September. That position was still vacant at the end of the year. Despite the multiple staff changes, the Conflict Defender Office staff provided quality representation in **1935** cases in 2016.

Under the joint Monroe County/Monroe County Bar Association Plan for Conflict Assignments, assigned counsel panel attorneys, attorneys in private practice willing to represent indigent clients, accepted assignments in all town and village courts, all felony cases, Family Court cases, all statutorily assigned cases in Superior Court as well as all cases where the Conflict Defender Office has a conflict of interest. As of the end of the year, there were **162** private attorneys accepting assignments, and they handled **1939** assignments in 2016.

This report outlines, with statistical information, the Program's success in meeting the goals of the Plan which are articulated here:

"The objectives of this conflict assignments plan are to provide quality representation to eligible indigent defendants or other litigants in those cases where the Public Defender has a conflict of interest; to provide a coordinated and centralized assignment system for conflict cases arising in the courts specified in Article IV herein; to provide a more equitable distribution of conflict assignments among lawyers; to attract more lawyers willing to handle conflict assignments; to maintain uniform and proper billing practices; to ensure cost accountability of services, and to provide increased efficiency for the courts by making qualified attorneys more readily available to handle conflict cases."
Monroe County Bar Association Sponsored Plan for Conflict Assignments, ARTICLE II. Plan Objectives

"To Provide Quality Representation"

In 2016, the number of total assignments was nearly identical to the number for 2015, holding at approximately 7,200 total assignments. Likewise, the total felony numbers were similar to last year's numbers, around 1,100. A notable exception was for homicide cases, where the total was 27 in 2016, down from 35 in 2015 and 45 in 2014. Also down substantially was the misdemeanor total, with a decrease of approximately 200 assignments from 2015's total. On the other hand, in some other areas, the number of assignments rose sharply in 2016. Probation and Parole violations were up over a third. Assignments in our "other" category (primarily assignments for witnesses), was up over 200%, from 40 in 2015 to 142 in 2016. This was due to the "excellence initiative", put into place by the Chief Judge; this initiative was a push to speed up the time a criminal case takes from arrest to trial. This new court policy increased the number of trials that took place in Monroe County over past year. As the number of trials in Monroe County rose substantially this year, the need for counsel to represent witnesses rose as well.

In 2015, the number of Family Court cases rose over 3,000 for the first time, and that trend continued this year with 3,634 Family Court cases. The number of appeals

rose slightly this year, and it is expected that the number of appeals will rise substantially over the next few years as the number of trials has gone up in 2016. A number of the appeals initially assigned to The Office of The Conflict Defender needed re-assigning to independent counsel due to a conflict of interest. Also, some of the appeals being assigned to CDO were/are already three-four years old, which means that they may need to be assigned out to an ACP attorney due to concerns regarding potential habeas corpus relief: this was done on a small scale in 2015 and 2016 pursuant to another OILS grant. In both of these situations, additional assignment of attorneys was required, and can be expected to result in increased payments in 2017-2018.

All Assigned Counsel panel attorneys have qualified for their respective panels under the enhanced requirements for panel membership that were implemented in 2014 by then-Conflict Defender Charles Noce, Esq. These panel requirements remain in effect in an ongoing effort to continue to maintain and enhance the quality of representation that indigent clients in Monroe County receive.

With respect to the Conflict Defender Office, the attorneys handling appeals and misdemeanor cases in Rochester City Court were able to maintain a high level of representation for their clients, as were the staff attorneys assigned to Monroe County Family Court (including the three OILS grant funded positions).

As the Continuing Legal Education (CLE) requirements of all staff attorneys of the Conflict Defender Office and panel attorneys for the Assigned Counsel Program overlap with the Mandatory Continuing Legal Education requirements of the State of New York, compliance is 100%.

However, it is a goal of the Conflict Defender Office, in conjunction with the appropriate committees of the Bar Association, to create more opportunities for training of attorneys. This is of a particularly necessity in Family Court.

"To Provide a Coordinated and Centralized Assignment System for Conflict Cases"

The Assigned Counsel Program is fully computerized, and has been through a number of electronic transformations. The initial computer program (2003-2010) entered all cases reported in it to a centralized database that tracked the representation from assignment through payment of the voucher for all cases; both Assigned Counsel and Conflict Defender cases. At the end of calendar year 2011, a new database was purchased for use by the office, and the underlying support system needed for the use

of the prior ACP Database was discontinued. This system was in operation from approximately 2011-until August 2016. In August 2016, a new electronic voucher system and overall conflict case assignment database became operational. Early experience with this new integrated system, in the last quarter of 2016, has resulted in a savings on time and effort, as well as an improvement on efficiency.

Assignments referred by the courts continue to be assigned from a rotating list of qualified attorneys (as is required by New York State law) who meet the requirements to be on the varying panels. The program, when used by the Courts, is very successful in insuring continuity of counsel where a client is re-arrested on new charges, even when the arrests span differing jurisdictions. Additionally, the program continues to track conflict of interest information so that panel attorneys are not unnecessarily assigned when the Conflict Defender Office could ethically continue.

"To Provide a More Equitable Distribution of Conflict Assignments Among Lawyers"

The Assigned Counsel Program continually strives to improve its system of assignment of conflict cases. The Program constantly attempts to implement new and better systems to distribute assignments more equitably among the participating attorneys. In criminal cases, the current system is highly effective when fully utilized by the Courts of Monroe County. There are, however, still several local criminal courts that do not fully utilize the services of the program in the assignment of counsel. This sometimes leads to a client having multiple attorneys for different pending charges, which can result in uncoordinated representation, as well as increased and unnecessary costs to the taxpayer.

As Courts often need attorneys very quickly, those available when called get a disproportionate number of assignments. Thus, the assignment distribution can be skewed toward those attorneys who were most available for assignments. It should be noted; that attorneys may notify the Conflict Office of their availability on certain dates and at certain times (particularly around holidays and long weekends) so we may contact them when an assignment opportunity occurs on that date and time. Notice can be emailed, telephoned or faxed to our office.

In Family Court, the equitable distribution of cases remains an issue in cases not represented by the Conflict Defender staff. Most assignments to panel attorneys in Family Court are made directly from the bench. This results in a few attorneys

receiving a disproportionate number of assignments. It remains a goal of the Conflict Defender Office to address the inequities in Family Court assignments. The fact that a very few attorneys receive the bulk of the assignments places an undue burden on those attorneys and can impact directly on the quality of representation.

"To Attract More Lawyers Willing to Handle Conflict Assignments"

Included in this report (see page 7) is a list of new panel members added during the 2016 calendar year.

These attorneys were added to the panels under the requirements for panel membership that were implemented in 2014 by then-Conflict Defender Charles Noce, Esq. These panel requirements were created and remain in effect in an ongoing effort to continue to enhance the quality of representation that indigent clients in Monroe County receive.

Generally, plenty of qualified assigned counsel attorneys remain on all panels and are available to meet requests for assignment of counsel by the courts. Due to a various circumstances, the Homicide panel lost some members this year, depleting the ranks of qualified attorneys in that area.

"To Maintain Uniform and Proper Billing Practices and to Ensure Cost Accountability of Services"

As was the case in previous years, the Conflict Defender reviews each voucher to insure compliance with the voucher regulations and notifies each attorney of any noncompliance to educate the attorney on proper procedures. The review and notification help maintain proper and uniform billing practices among the participating attorneys.

Having received a Grant from the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services to fund the purchase of an electronic vouchering system, the system became operational in August 2016. It is anticipated that the use of the electronic voucher system will increase the efficiency and accuracy of reviewing vouchers.

In 2016, the "excellence initiative" was put into place by the Chief Judge; this initiative was a push to speed up the time a criminal case takes from arrest to trial. This

new court policy increased the number of trials that took place in Monroe County over past year. The increase in the number of trials by assigned counsel had a corresponding effect of increasing the average voucher.

"To Provide Increased Efficiency for the Courts"

The Courts that fully utilizing the services of the Assigned Counsel Program report a positive impact on the efficiency in obtaining assigned counsel in conflict cases. These Courts report a significant decrease in the burden on the court staff in finding attorneys willing to accept assignments and a prompt response from the Assigned Counsel Program in obtaining assigned counsel.

It is anticipated that the new electronic voucher system will increase the efficiency in voucher processing time as vouchers can be transmitted between the Conflict Defender Office and the Courts electronically instead of through the mail, and can be accessed from any computer with a login username and password.

The efficiency of the Courts has clearly been facilitated by the dedicated attorneys serving on the assigned counsel panels, and the staff attorneys in the Office of the Conflict Defender, while ensuring high quality representation in Family Court, all of the criminal and appellate courts in 2016.

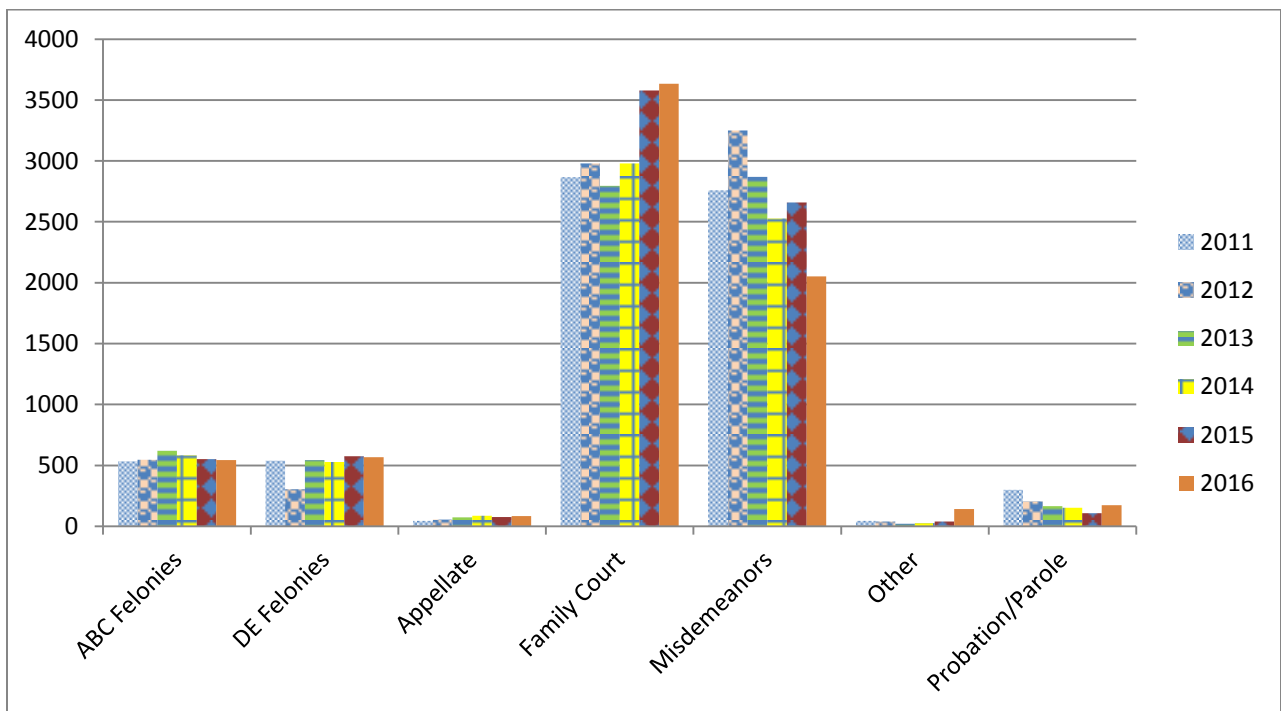

2016 Assignments⁵

The following charts show the assignments each attorney received in 2016. The number of assignments is higher than the number of cases referred because in some cases more than one attorney receives an assignment for a case. Also, an attorney might be assigned in 2016 to a case originally referred in a previous year. This occurs most often after a court relieves one attorney and either the court or the Assigned Counsel Program assigns a new attorney.

Several factors should be considered in looking at these tables. First, approved panel members receive more assignments than non-approved panel members do. Some of the attorneys with a low number of assignments are non-approved panel members. Most often, such an attorney is court assigned. Secondly, those attorneys gaining membership on a panel for the first time during 2016 will have fewer assignments in that panel because they were not on the panel for an entire year. Thirdly, a number of attorneys decline a significant number of assignments, requested removal from the Program for periods of time or resigned from the Program during 2016. While the report includes non-approved attorneys, new panel members, attorneys declining appointments, and attorneys temporarily removed from panels at their own request, concentrating on those members who participated for the full year as approved members of a particular panel gives a truer picture of the equitable distribution of assignments.

Of particular significance in this report is the fact that in the criminal courts, where the Assigned Counsel Program assigns a large percentage of cases, there is a more even distribution of assignments. This is attributable to the fact that, by comparison, Family Court has a much lower percentage of cases assigned by the Assigned Counsel Program: most assignments are directed by the court. Attaining more equitable distribution of cases is difficult, if not impossible. The Administrator and Advisory Committee must work diligently to provide a workable solution to the inequities of the Family Court assignments. Looking at the last column of the tables, it takes significantly fewer attorneys for the Family Court assignments to reach a high percentage than it does for the criminal court assignments. This is less of a concern since the Conflict Defender Office represents the bulk of the conflict cases in Family Court. Nonetheless, it is an issue that should be addressed for those cases where the Conflict Defender Office cannot represent the client in Family Court.

2016 Table of Program Use by Judiciary⁶

The table below shows the number of assignments for each Judge making at least one assignment during 2016. The statistics, between this chart and the attorney assignments, clearly show that Rochester City Court, which assigns the greatest number of cases in the County, is very high in percentage of cases assigned through the Assigned Counsel Program. These facts directly correlate to the fact that the distribution of cases among the attorneys is greatest for criminal cases. Conversely, the statistics show that Family Court has a much lower percentage of cases assigned through the Assigned Counsel Program when removing those cases assigned to the Conflict Defender Office. There has been some progress in Family Court toward the increased use of the Assigned Counsel Program.
