Notable Court Proceedings

33-year-old **Martine Gibson** was sentenced by Monroe County Court Judge Ansaldi to 15 years in the New York State Department of Corrections plus 5 years of post-release supervision. Gibson previously pled guilty to Manslaughter in the 1st Degree for his role in the homicide of Jahkeem Douglas. This case was investigated by the Rochester Police Department and prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Merrick Sadler, Chief of Vehicular Crimes Bureau.

27-year-old **Marquell Miller** was sentenced by Monroe County Court Judge Morrison to 2 and 1/3 - 7 years in the New York State Department of Corrections. Miller previously pled guilty to Manslaughter in the 2nd Degree and two counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 3rd degree for his role in the accidental homicide of Aaron Hurrell. This case was investigated by the Rochester Police Department and prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney <u>Stephen Ryck</u>, of Major Felony Bureau.

Grand Jury Indictments

Oscar Loyola-Ledesma was indicted on Murder in the 2nd Degree in relation to the homicide of Antonio Rodriguez-Cervantes. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Ryan Lamon</u>, of the Major Felony Bureau.

Michael Shoff was indicted on two counts of Menacing a Police Officer Or Peace Officer. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Camille Ingino</u>, of the Major Felony Bureau.

Tyrone Newsome was indicted on Attempted Murder in the 2nd Degree, Assault in the 1st Degree, and two counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2nd Degree. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Aliyah Fowler</u>, of the Non-Fatal Shooting Taskforce.

Cynthia Deniece Jones was indicted on Insurance Fraud in the 3rd Degree, six counts of Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument in the 2nd Degree, and four counts of Identity Theft in the 1st Degree. This case is being prosecuted by ADA Amy Crosier, of the Public Integrity/Economic Crimes Bureau.

Brandon Carter was indicted on Assault in the 2nd Degree and Resisting Arrest in relation to an assault against a Rochester Police Officer. This case is being prosecuted by ADA Christopher Folk, of the Major Felony Bureau.

People vs. Anthony Jenkins

The defendant is charged with Robbery in the $1^{\rm st}$ Degree, two counts of Robbery in the $2^{\rm nd}$ Degree, Kidnapping in the $2^{\rm nd}$ Degree, and Assault in the $2^{\rm nd}$ Degree in front of New York State Supreme Court Justice Moran. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Christopher Folk</u>, of the Major Felony Bureau.

People vs. Curtis Griffin

The defendant is charged with Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2^{nd} Degree in front of New York State Supreme Court Justice Sinclair. The case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Kelly Pettrone</u> of the Special Investigations Bureau.

People vs. Luke Calla

The defendant is charged with Strangulation in the 2^{nd} Degree, Criminal Obstruction of Breathing or Blood Circulation, and two counts of Assault in the 3^{rd} Degree in front of New York State Supreme Cour Justice Renzi. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Kenisha Flowers</u>, of the Special Victims Unit.

People vs. Ernest Jones

The defendant is charged with Course of Sexual Conduct Against a Child in the 2nd Degree and Rape in the 3rd Degree in front of New York State Supreme Court Schiano. This case is being prosecuted by ADA <u>Janna Jehlen</u>, of the Special Victims Unit.
