This past weekend, I had the opportunity to participate in the BROS Brunch, a community forum centered on the wellness of Black and Brown men. I was invited to speak about the criminal justice system, including plea negotiations, fairness, and some of the questions and concerns people have about how justice is administered.

These are not always easy conversations, but I believe they are necessary ones.

Since becoming District Attorney, I have made community engagement a priority. To me, that means more than attending events or speaking to groups that already know and support us. It means being willing to walk into rooms where people may have questions, concerns, criticism, or even distrust of the criminal justice system as a whole.

I believe a District Attorney needs to be accessible, and accessibility requires a willingness to listen as much as it requires a willingness to speak.

Some of the most valuable conversations I have had over the past year have been the most challenging. Public forums, roundtables, neighborhood events, and discussions like the BROS Brunch give us an opportunity to explain what we do and why, but they also give me an opportunity to hear directly from the people we serve. We may not always agree, but there is value in having an open and respectful conversation and in making sure people know their concerns are being heard.

I am grateful to Lorenzo Marc Williams for inviting me into that conversation and to everyone who was willing to ask thoughtful questions, share their experiences, and engage in an important discussion. Our office belongs to the people of Monroe County. We cannot serve this community effectively from behind our desks alone. We have to show up, listen, answer difficult questions, and continue building relationships.



MCDAs in the Community

Monroe County District Attorney Brian Green and Assistant District Attorneys from the Special Victims Unit attended the Child Advocacy Center of Greater Rochester's Annual Dinner. Notable Indictments

An indictment was unsealed charging 34-year-old **Jonathan Shearin** with Murder in the 2nd Degree in relation to the murder of 77-year-old Marc Stekloff on July 1, 2026. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Kaylee Rizzari, of the Special Victims Unit.

An indictment was unsealed charging 19-year-old **Gemarion Parson** with Murder in the 2nd Degree and two counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2nd Degree in relation to the murder of Willie Mayhall on November 18, 2025. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Aaron Rath, of the Special Investigations Bureau.

An indictment was unsealed charging 42-year-old **Lancysa Harris, Jr.** and 57-year-old **Andrea Livers** with Murder in the 2nd Degree, Kidnapping in the 1st Degree, and Endangering the Welfare of an Incompetent or Physically Disabled Person in relation to the murder of 33-year-old Timothy Green. This case is being prosecuted by First Assistant District Attorney Perry Duckles and Assistant District Attorney Hillary Langdon, Chief of the Special Victims Unit.

37-year-old **Leroy Williams** was indicted on Robbery in the 1st Degree, two counts of Robbery in the 2nd Degree, and Assault in the 2nd Degree. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Ryan Lamon, of the Major Felony Bureau.

38-year-old **Erik Gibbs** was indicted on four counts of Identity Theft in the 2nd Degree, three count of Grand Larceny in the 4th Degree, and one count of Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument in the 2nd Degree. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Amy Crosier, of the Public Integrity/Economic Crimes Bureau.

37-year-old **Jeremi Miller** was indicted on Rape in the 1st Degree, five counts of Criminal Contempt in the 1st Degree, Robbery in the 3rd Degree, Criminal Obstruction of Breathing or Blood Circulation, Menacing in the 2nd Degree, Aggravated Criminal Contempt, and Assault in the 3rd Degree. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Janna Jehlen, of the Special Victims Unit.

55-year-old **Michael Rech** was indicted on two counts of Attempted Aggravated Assault Upon A Police Officer or Peace Officer, two counts of Assault in the 2nd Degree, and twenty-one counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 3rd Degree. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Kristin Sippel, of the Major Felony Bureau.
