Bernard Snow Convicted of 3 Counts of Robbery in the Third Degree

Rochester, NY- Today, a Monroe County Jury found 46 year old Bernard Snow guilty of 2 counts of Robbery in the Third Degree and 1 count of Petit Larceny for three separate bank robberies. At approximately 1pm, on September 30, 2015 Bernard Snow robbed the First Niagra Bank on 19 W. Main Street in the City of Rochester. The following day at approximately 3:50pm, Snow robbed the Chase Bank on 36 Genesee Street in the City of Rochester. And, on October 2, 2015 at approximately 4:20pm, Snow robbed the M&T Bank on 1386 Lyell Avenue in the City of Rochester. The jury convicted Snow of counts 1 & 2 and on count 3, the jury found Snow guilty of the lessor included charge of Petit Larceny for stealing \$643.00.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Assistant District Attorney Laura Vanderbrook of the Violent Felony Bureau.

"Bernard Snow demonstrated with his actions his disregard for the safety and security of members of this community. His brazen decision to rob three different banks in just three days justifies the jury's verdict today. The community is a safer place with Bernard Snow secured behind bars," said Assistant District Attorney Laura Vanderbrook.

Bernard Snow will be sentenced on March 28, 2016, by Supreme Court Justice Thomas Moran. Snow is eligible to be declared a persistent felony offender. If the court finds him to be a persistent offender, his sentence will be 15 years to life.
