Amos Hill Sentenced to 18 Years after Pleading Guilty to Manslaughter in the First Degree

Rochester, NY- On Tuesday, July 12, 2022, New York State Supreme Court Justice Renzi sentenced 37-year-old Amos Hill to 18 years in the New York State Department of Corrections with five years post-release supervision. This sentence comes after he previously pled guilty to Manslaughter in the First Degree for the murder of Michael Adams.

On June 21, 2021, Amos Hill stabbed Michael Adams in his neck on Genesee Street; Mr. Adams died shortly thereafter from his injuries.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Elizabeth Buckley, Chief of the Local Courts Bureau and Assistant District Attorney John Marsella, of the Public Corruption/Economic Crime Bureau.

"I want to thank the Rochester Police Department for their thorough investigation on this case," said Assistant District Attorney Elizabeth Buckley. "Amos Hill senselessly took the life of Michael Adams with no regard for human life. This sentence is one that holds him accountable for his terrible actions."

"Today's sentencing while unable to undo Amos Hill's horrendous actions, hopefully will provide some justice for the family and friends who Michael Adams left behind," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "One more violent offender will be off the street with 18 years in the New York State Department of Corrections."
