Terry Coley Convicted of Five Counts of Robbery in the 2nd Degree

Rochester, NY- Tuesday, August 15, 2017, a Monroe County Jury convicted 22-year-old Terry Coley of five counts of Robbery in the 2nd Degree for five separate gun point robberies in the Town of Irondequoit. Coley robbed Kwik Fill gas station cashiers at gun point in Irondequoit four separate times between May 2016 and September 2016. He also held up an Irondequoit bank on June 20, 2016, during which he pointed his gun at five bank tellers one by one while demanding money. He also threatened the dozen or so civilians in the bank at that time. Coley escaped the bank with \$18,000, which was destroyed by dye packs.

Terry Coley was arrested after his final robbery at the Kwik Fill on September 14, 2016, after a detailed investigation led by the Irondequoit Police Department. Irondequoit Police Officers tracked Coley to his apartment where he was then arrested.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Assistant District Attorney Laura Vanderbrook of the Major Felony Bureau.

"Terry Coley is a calculated criminal who violently took money from establishments by pointing a gun in the face of their employees," said Assistant District Attorney Laura Vanderbrook. "I want to thank the Irondequoit Police Department for the outstanding police work done to identify and apprehend Terry Coley. Nobody in this community deserves to live in fear when going to work or frequenting a place of business. Now the people in Irondequoit no longer have to worry about Terry Coley plaguing their streets with violence."

Terry Coley will be sentenced on October 10, 2017, at 9:30AM by State Supreme Court Justice Moran. He faces a maximum of 75 years in the New York State Department of Corrections.
