Dean Klejment Convicted for Multiple Residential Burglaries and Car Larcenies

Rochester, NY- Friday, April 5, 2018, a Monroe County Jury convicted 52-year-old Dean Klejment of two counts of Burglary in the 2nd Degree, two counts of Grand Larceny in the 4th degree, three counts of Petit Larceny, and one count of Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the 5th Degree.

On May 2-11, 2018, Dean Klejment committed several residential burglaries and car larcenies in Irondequoit, Pittsford, Perinton, and the City of Rochester. Klejment has been incarcerated for the majority of his adult life. He will be sentenced as a Persistent Felony Offender due to his multiple previous violent felony convictions.

The case was prosecuted by Special Assistant District Attorney Chris Bokelman, of the Major Felony Bureau.

"Today's verdict is justice for the numerous members of our community who were affected by this defendant's actions over the nine day period of time," said Assistant District Attorney Chris Bokelman. "We appreciate the investigative efforts of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, as well as members of the Rochester Police Department and Irondequoit Police Department. The collaboration between all three agencies played an important role in securing this conviction."

"The defendant showed a complete disregard for the safety and security of his victims," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "As a Persistent Felony Offender, Dean Klejment will have a long time in the New York State Department of Corrections to think about the choices he made."

Dean Klejment will be sentenced on May 16 in front of New York State Supreme Court Justice Victoria Argento.
