LaJason Lovett Convicted of Murder in the 2nd Degree

Rochester, NY- Friday, August 11, 2023, a Monroe County Jury convicted 46-year-old Lajson Lovett of Murder in the 2nd Degree for the murder of Cory Dubois.

On September 8, 2022, Cory Dubois was driven to St. Mary's Medical Campus with multiple stab wounds, where he was pronounced dead. Mr. Dubois was ambushed as he entered the backyard of 27 Angle Street. The defendant stabbed Cory Dubois twelve times.

After a detailed investigation, the Rochester Police Department arrested LaJason Lovett as the person who stabbed and killed Cory Dubois. LasJason Lovett was on probation for a previous assault charge at the time of the murder.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Assistant District Attorney Ralph Alloco, of the Special Victims Unit.

"LaJason Lovett was a coward, hiding behind a tree while he waited for Corey Dubois," said Assistant District Attorney Ralph Alloco. "The defendant ambushed Corey with a knife, violently stabbing and killing him. I want to thank the Rochester Police Department's Major Crimes Unit for their detailed investigation, resulting in the successful prosecution of LaJason Lovett. Our community is safer with LaJason Lovett incarcerated, as he has proven to be a violent person and a danger to our community."

"LaJason Lovett intended to kill Corey Dubois last September," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "LaJason Lovett ambushed the victim and began stabbing, taking Corey's life. Even though they will never get their loved one back, it is our hope that the family and friends of Cory Dubois all feel a sense of justice in today's verdict."

LaJason Lovett will be sentenced on September 21, 2023, in front of New York State Supreme Court Justice Argento. He faces up to 25 years to Life in the New York State Department of Corrections.
