## Quintel Crockton Sentenced to 23 Years for the Homicide of Terran Felder

Rochester, NY- On Monday, June 9, 2025, New York State Supreme Court Justice Schiano sentenced 40-year-old Quintel Crockton to 23 years in the New York State Department of Corrections plus 5 years of post-release supervision. He was previously convicted by a jury of Manslaughter in the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree for the homicide of Terran Felder.

On August 23, 2023, at approximately 9:30p.m., Rochester Police Officers were called to Quick Food Market on Jay Street in the City of Rochester regarding a disturbance inside the store. Upon arrival, officers located 61-year-old Terran Felder dead inside the store.

After a thorough investigation by the Rochester Police Department, it was determined that the victim was assaulted by someone outside the store and the assault continued inside the store, where Mr. Felder became incapacitated and died. Quintel Crockton was identified as the assailant, who repeatedly beat and stomped the victim to death.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Kevin Sunderland, Chief of the Local Courts Bureau.

"Quintel Crockton's deliberate and brutal attack led to the tragic death of Terran Felder," said Assistant District Attorney Kevin Sunderland. "I want to commend the Rochester Police Department for their detailed and effective investigation that led to Crockton's identification and arrest. Despite Terran's desperate attempts to escape, Crockton relentlessly assaulted him until he lost his life. Our community is safer today knowing that Crockton will serve 23 years in the New York State Department of Corrections, far from Monroe County."

"The violence inflicted by Quintel Crockton was merciless and deadly, leaving Terran Felder incapacitated and ultimately causing his death," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "This case clearly shows that Crockton poses a serious threat to public safety. We hope that during his time in the New York State Department of Corrections, he reflects on the devastating impact of his actions. This sentence brings much-needed justice and closure to Terran Felder's family and friends."
