Robert Norry Convicted of Murder in the Second Degree

Rochester, NY- Monday, April 29, 2019, a Monroe County Jury convicted 33-year-old Robert Norry of Murder in the 2nd Degree for the death of Kelly O'May.

On June 13, 2018, Robert Norry stabbed his girlfriend, Kelly O'May, to death in their apartment. He then fled to the State of Washington. On June 16, 2018, he was apprehended by Washington State Patrol and later brought back to New York State.

The case was prosecuted by Special Assistant District Attorney Meredith Vacca, of the Child Abuse Bureau and Senior Assistant District Attorney Kevin Sunderland, of the Special Investigations Bureau.

"I want to sincerely thank the family of Kelly O'May who was there for every step of the way during their time of grief," said Assistant District Attorney Meredith Vacca. "I want to also commend the great team at the Rochester Police Department and the Washington State Patrol who pieced together the investigation and brought him back to Rochester, NY for a fair trial."

"This case is a tragic example of the devastation caused by domestic violence in our community," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "Robert will now be spending years in the New York State Department of Corrections for taking the life of someone he was supposed to love. The Monroe County District Attorney's Office urges anyone struggling in a domestic violence situation to reach out to law enforcement or the Willow Domestic Violence Center."

Robert Norry will be sentenced on May 30, 2019, in front of State Supreme Court Justice Victoria Argento. He faces up to 25 years to life in the New York State Department of Corrections.
