Tyshon Myles Convicted of Murder in the 2nd Degree for the Death of Moran Wilson

Rochester, NY- On Thursday, November 1, 2018, a Monroe County Jury convicted 26-year-old Tyshon Myles of one count of Murder in the 2nd Degree for the death of Moran Wilson. He was also convicted of Kidnapping in the 1st Degree, Burglary in the 1st Degree, Robbery in the 1st Degree, Robbery in the 2nd Degree and Tampering with Physical Evidence.

On May 12, 2017, Myles, along with others, caused the death of Moran Wilson and did so during the course of a kidnapping. On the evening of May 13, 2017, the Rochester Police Department discovered Wilson's remains buried in the backyard of 52 Dayton Street in the City of Rochester. Medical evidence presented at the trial showed that Wilson was brutally beaten and suffocated ultimately leading to his death.

Myles is facing up to 25 years to life in the New York State Department of Corrections for the Murder in the 2nd Degree and Kidnapping in the 1st Degree convictions and up to 25 years for the Burglary in the 1st Degree, Robbery in the 1st Degree and Robbery in the 2nd Degree convictions. Myles is facing an additional 1 and 1/3 to 4 years for Tampering with Physical Evidence.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney David Dys, Chief of the Non-Violent Felony Bureau and Senior Assistant District Attorney Rachel Clark of the Major Felony Bureau.

"Tyshon Myles intentionally and heinously took the life of Moran Wilson," said Assistant District Attorney David Dys. "We hope this conviction will bring a sense of justice and closure to Moran's suffering family. This conviction would not have been possible without the thorough investigative work of the Rochester Police Department."

"This case is one of the most vicious murders we've seen at the Monroe County District Attorney's Office," said District Attorney Sandra Doorley. "These convictions illustrate how effective the collaborative efforts between law enforcement, the District Attorney's Office and private citizens can be in bringing justice to those who commit these brutal crimes."

Tyshon Myles is scheduled for sentencing in front of Judge Judith A. Sinclair on November 26, 2018.

Genisis Colon and Alvin Hancock were previously convicted in June of 2018 and are currently pending sentencing.
