Seventeen Year Old Kamron Campbell Pled Guilty to Murder in the Second Degree, Attempted Robbery in the First Degree and 2 Counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the Second Degree

Rochester, NY- Today, 17 year old, Kamron Campbell pled guilty to Murder in the Second Degree, Attempted Robbery in the First Degree and 2 counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the Second Degree. On July 19, 2015, Campbell and his two co-defendants, Le'Sean Foucha and Kahlil Nelson fatally shot Nepalese refugee, Jit Mongar outside a convenience store on Lake Avenue in the City of Rochester. Mongar is the father of seven children and had only been in the country for two years. He was shot in an attempted robbery and was pronounced dead upon his arrival at the hospital. Both Nelson and Foucha previously pled guilty to Murder in the Second Degree for their role in Mongars death. Le'Sean Foucha was already sentenced to 15 years to life and Kahlil Nelson will be sentenced by Supreme Court Justice Alex R. Renzi on September 14, 2016.

The case was prosecuted Assistant District Attorney Julie Hahn, Chief of the Major Felony Bureau.

"Kamron Campbell along with two other young men took the life of a hard working father of seven in an attempt to rob him," said Assistant District Attorney Julie Hahn. "We had a strong case against all three men and as a result, all three pled guilty. Today's guilty plea brings justice to Jit Mongar's family and it is our hope that as a result, they can begin the healing process."

Kamron Campbell will be sentenced on October 12, 2016 by Supreme Court Justice Alex R. Renzi.
