Nyjee Boyd Convicted Of All Charges

Rochester, NY- Yesterday, a Monroe County Jury found 21 year old Nyjee Boyd guilty of Second Degree Attempted Murder, First Degree Assault, First Degree Criminal Use of a Firearm and Two Counts of Second Degree Criminal Possession of a Weapon for an attempted murder that occurred the evening of April 3, 2014, outside Chester's Check Cashing Plaza at 886 N. Clinton Avenue. On that date, Nyjee Boyd approached a vehicle on the passenger side and fired multiple rounds from his revolver into the car, striking 21 year old, Thomas Segelin. After being shot, Thomas Segelin called 911 for assistance.

The case was prosecuted by Special Assistant District Attorney Michael J. Harrigan of the Major Felony Bureau.

"The community is a safer place with this conviction. This trial could have very easily been a Murder Trial had the victim not been able to dial 911. According to medical testimony, the victim was seriously injured and essentially saved his own life with the call he placed to emergency personnel," said Assistant District Attorney Michael J. Harrigan. "Nyjee Boyd clearly intended to kill Thomas Segelin that evening. We thank the jury for holding Mr. Boyd accountable for his actions."

Nyjee Boyd will be sentenced on June 30, 2015 by Supreme Court Justice Daniel J. Doyle. Nyjee Boyd faces 10-30 years in prison with 5 years post release supervision.
