Dear Neighbor:

Monroe County plans to rehabilitate **Salt Road from Atlantic Avenue to Plank Road** in the Town of Penfield.

Enclosed with this letter are a pamphlet describing the project and a comment form. Additional information regarding the project, including a brief 12 minute presentation, can be viewed on the Monroe County DOT website, Project Updates page:

The intent of this project is to rehabilitate the existing asphalt roadway, as well as to construction 5 foot wide paved shoulders on both sides of Salt Road. We are also planning drainage improvements along the road by regrading existing ditches and by installing some new storm sewer systems. In addition, we plan to enclose the deep ditch south of the fire house on the west side of Salt Road.

Although some preliminary utility relocations may occur by utility companies this fall ahead of our project, the main roadway rehabilitation work is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2022. During that time, work will occur while traffic is being alternated around work zones with flaggers. We plan to complete the project in one construction season, by the fall of 2022.
