	<ul> <li>NYSDOH</li> <li>BEI All County Conference Call- highlights</li> <li>Family Outcome Survey-Report from BEI</li> <li>Child Outcome Study – 2019 Cohort</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The All county conference call is a quarterly call with the Bureau of Early Intervention This month they discussed the APR report (Annual Performance indicators regarding timeliness of service, Initial IFSPs, transition to preschool and Child outcome study.) The 2017-18 data showed NYS to receive "Meets requirements" for the first time in a long time. BEI thanks the districts for their efforts.</li> <li>Robin wondered about how average results from a state wide system might not indicate the difficulties experienced on one region.</li> <li>The call discussed capacity concerns in a collaborative way, with many counties indicating significant difficulty finding providers. Discussion at today's LEIC about our use of the capacity list included ideas about how to make it "live" using something like Google Docs.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Roxana to get the statistics about how much of the EI population state wide is in NYC as compared to the ROS</li> <li>Monroe County to ask other counties how they manage their capacity lists.</li> </ul>
Program Updates	<ul> <li>Local Program</li> <li>Cohort 2 SSIP- Family Engagement</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>County shared the model flyer we are piloting as part of our cohort 2 State Systemic Improvement Plan. We are working with the library to promote families using their services and locations by distributing a flyer at the 6<sup>th</sup> month IFSP review. The group suggested not waiting so long to introducing it and to use the assistance of providers to promote the library as a resource. Other suggestions were to add more resources to the list, not just the library. This feedback will be added to the results of the pilot project and be reported back to the state</li> </ul>	• Monroe County to include LEICC's feedback in our reporting to the State about the SSIP.

Concern about underserved zip codes was mentioned (some city and some far west areas).</li> <li>Use of partnerships with Parents as Teachers and the possible central locations of services and groups was discussed including Strong Museum, libraries and rec centers.</li> </ul>
