# **Monroe County Department of Public Health COVID-19 Update**

10 a.m. Monday March 23, 2020

#### **Confirmed Cases**

There are 80 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Monroe County.

#### **New Cases**

There are 12 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 since 4 p.m. update on Sunday March 22. The new individuals include:

- 1 Female in her 20s
- 1 Female in her 30s
- 2 Males in their 40s
- 2 Females in their 60s
- 2 Males in their 60s
- 1 Female in her 70s
- 2 Males in their 80s
- 1 Male in his 90s

## COVID-19 testing information will be updated at 4 p.m. today

### Hospitalized patients

Of the 80 confirmed cases, 11 people are hospitalized. 5 of the 11 patients are in ICU.

### **Mandatory Quarantine**

The Health Department is monitoring 395 people in mandatory quarantine and isolation, but EVERYONE should be staying at home except for essential activities.

### **Additional Details**

IMPORTANT REMINDER ABOUT TESTING FOR COVID-19.

There are a limited number of COVID-19 tests available in Monroe County and not everyone with potential symptoms of COVID-19 can be tested.

For most people, the results of a test for COVID-19 will have no impact on what happens next. Everyone should already be staying home, practicing social distancing, and talking with their healthcare providers to manage any symptoms. Having a positive test result does not change this guidance.

The tests are reserved for individuals for whom test results will have an impact on what happens next. For example:

- A healthcare worker or first responder who tests negative can return to work more quickly.
- A hospitalized patient who tests negative can be removed from isolation, which saves PPE usage.

Monroe County continues to ask residents to practice social distancing and follow the guidance of the Monroe County Department of Public Health. To the extent possible, everyone should stay home.
