New Cases

There are 43 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the 4 p.m. update on Monday, April 13.

These new individuals include:

- 3 Females in their 30s
- 1 Females in her 40s
- 2 Females in their 50s
- 2 Males in their 50s
- 5 Females in their 60s

- 10 Females in their 80s
- 2 Males in their 80s
- 5 Females in their 90s

Deaths

There were 6 new deaths since Monday, April 13, bringing the total to 56.

Age Range of Deceased

- 3 people 59 years of age or younger
- 6 people between 60-69 years of age
- 19 people between 70-79 years of age
- 15 people between 80-89 years of age
- 13 people between 90-99 years of age



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Hospitalized

Of the 834 confirmed cases, 97 people are hospitalized. 35 of the 97 patients are in the ICU on a ventilator.

Recovered from Isolation

Today's report includes cumulative data of cases who have "Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed." These are confirmed positive cases who have recovered.

There have been 348 Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed to date.

Race/Ethnicity Breakdown
