There are 46 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the 4 p.m. update on Saturday, May 16.

Deaths

There was 1 new death since Saturday, May 16, bringing the total to 172.

Hospitalized

Of the 2227 confirmed cases, 124 people are hospitalized. 21 of the 124 patients are in the ICU on a ventilator.

Recovered from Isolation

There have been 1144 Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed cases to date.

There have been 1398 total Recovered from Isolation to date. This number reflects confirmed positive COVID-19 cases and known presumed positive COVID-19 cases.

Testing

The 3-day average of daily total test taken in Monroe County is currently at 1232 tests per day (PCR and Antibody testing).

There have been 27923 total PCR tests received to date in Monroe County.
