There are 52 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the update on Friday, May 22.

Deaths

There were 3 new deaths since Friday, May 22, bringing the total to 191.

Hospitalized

Of the 2629 confirmed cases, 168 people are hospitalized. 14 of the 168 patients are in the ICU on a ventilator.



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Recovered from Isolation

There have been 1320 Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed cases to date.

There have been 1584 total Recovered from Isolation to date. This number reflects confirmed positive COVID-19 cases and known presumed positive COVID-19 cases.

Testing

The 3-day average of daily total test taken in Monroe County is currently at 1610 tests per day (PCR and Antibody testing).

There have been 32850 total PCR tests received to date in Monroe County.
