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## **Deaths**

There were 0 new deaths. The total is 277 to date.

## **Hospitalized**

Of the 4012 confirmed cases, 61 people are hospitalized, 4 patients are in the ICU on a ventilator.

## **Recovered from Isolation**

There have been 3329 Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed cases to date.

There have been 3650 total Recovered from Isolation to date. This number reflects confirmed positive COVID-19 cases and known presumed positive COVID-19 cases.

## **Testing**

The 3-day average of daily total test taken in Monroe County is currently at 1164 tests per day (PCR). There have been 87700 total PCR tests received to date in Monroe County.
