39 individuals are hospitalized, 8 people are in ICU on a ventilator.

Recovered from Isolation

There have been 3912 Recovered from Isolation – Confirmed cases to date.

There have been 4233 total Recovered from Isolation to date. This number reflects confirmed positive COVID-19 cases and known presumed positive COVID-19 cases.

Testing
