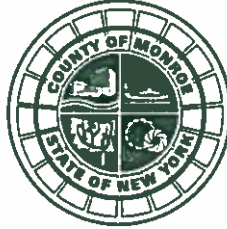

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that pursuant to Section A4-5 of the Monroe County Administrative Code, a public hearing will be held by the County Legislature of the County of Monroe on February 9, 2021, at 6:15 P.M. in the County Legislative Chambers in the County Office Building, Rochester, New York, on a proposed Local Law (Intro. No. 2 of 2021), entitled "PHARMACIES TO PROVIDE NOTICE ON THE AVAILABILITY OF NALOXONE".

This proposed legislation would require pharmacies in Monroe County to provide notice of the availability of Naloxone whenever they first fill an opioid prescription for a customer, whenever there is a change to a customer's opioid prescription, or whenever they next fill an opioid prescription for a customer after the effective date of the proposed local law.
