[Section 7. Section 1 of Resolution 399 of 2019 is further amended as follows:

The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute contracts, and any amendments thereto, with the agencies listed in Attachment A, and any other agencies as necessary, to provide mental health, developmental disability, and alcoholism and substance abuse services for Monroe County residents and individuals in need of emergency services in Monroe County, in an amount not to exceed \$39,831,545 \$40,131,545, for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.]

Honorable Legislators,

In a time of a serious pandemic, economic stress, and social unrest, it is the responsibility of the Federal government to provide financial aid and support for states and local governments. With a lack of leadership at the Federal level, New York State government leaders have stepped up admirably to provide various forms of relief, both financial and regulatory, to citizens, municipalities, and businesses alike. However, there is a limit to their ability to provide the scope of help we need. This is why the Federal government needs to finally take leadership in this crisis.

The Rockefeller Institute of Government examines where Federal funds are generated and spent, the balance-of-payments between the states, and provides the explanations for those differences. The findings are clear from its January, 2020 report. New York's residents and businesses send more total revenue to the Federal government than any other state and continue to contribute more in taxes than the state receives back in Federal spending. Key findings include:

- Over four years, New York taxpayers have given \$116.2 billion more to the federal government than they received back in federal spending.
- Preliminary analysis of 2018 data indicates that at -\$22.0 billion, New York maintains its 2017 rank as having the least favorable balance of payments of any state in the nation.
- New York's shortfall in 2018 is larger than that of second-ranked New Jersey (-\$11.5 billion) and third-ranked Massachusetts (-\$9.1 billion) combined. Connecticut and Colorado round out the list of the states with the least favorable balances.
- The New York State per capita balance of payments, -\$1,125, continues to rank as one of the least favorable in the nation. New York's negative per capita balance of payments is less than all but three other states.

- The Federal per capita balance of payments in 2018 is \$2,063. New Yorkers pay \$3,188 more than this average.
- Since 2015, the average annual excess burden for New York residents per capita has been \$3,235. The aggregate balance of payments for New Yorkers during this time period was over \$116 billion.

Therefore, we ask you to join us in memorializing the Congress to pass and the President to sign a package of aid to states and local governments, including New York State.



Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body adopt Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1) for use by all officers in legally disposing of records listed therein.

Pursuant to New York State Arts and Cultural Affairs Law § 57.25 and 8 NYCRR Part 185, the New York State Archives issued LGS-1 in August 2020 to consolidate and revise Records Retention and Disposition Schedules CO-2, MU-1, MI-1, and ED-1. These prior records and disposition schedules, including the schedule that currently applies to County records, CO-2, will expire on January 1, 2021.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Adopt Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1) for use by all officers in legally disposing of valueless records listed therein.
- 2. Affirm that only those records will be disposed of that are described in *Retention* and *Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1)*, after they have met the minimum retention periods described therein.
- 3. Affirm that only those records will be disposed of that do not have sufficient administrative, fiscal, legal, or historical value to merit retention beyond established legal minimum periods.

Acceptance of a Grant from the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee for the Child Passenger Safety Program (Department of Public Safety)

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee in the amount of \$9,995 for the Child Passenger Safety Program for the period of October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021.

This grant will fund the purchase of child safety seats, supplies and handouts for the Office of Traffic Safety's fitting station. A staff member, through a monthly fitting station, will inspect and oversee the installation of child safety seats along with increasing the knowledge of Monroe County residents on the proper use and installation of child safety seats. This will be the sixteenth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents a decrease of \$1,005 from last year.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$9,995 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee, for the Child Passenger Safety Program, for the period of October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021.
- 2. Amend the 2020 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety by appropriating the sum of \$9,995 into general fund 9300, funds center 2405100000, Traffic Safety Program.

- 3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements and to make any necessary funding modifications within grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.
- 4. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant is 100% funded by the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services in the amount of \$600,916 for the 2020-2021 Aid to Crime Laboratories Program for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

This grant will enable the Monroe County Crime Laboratory, which serves Monroe County and two (2) surrounding counties, to reimburse the payroll and fringe benefits for seven (7) existing positions within the Monroe County Crime Lab. Funding will supplement the Laboratory's operational budget for supplies, software and maintenance of equipment. This is the fourteenth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents a decrease of \$2.00 from last year.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$600,916 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services for the 2020-2021 Aid to Crime Laboratories Program for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center ("University of Oklahoma"), in an amount not to exceed \$70,000, for the Oklahoma Model Treatment Modality Training in the Problematic Sexual Behavior – Cognitive Behavior – Adolescent Treatment Program and a contract with Coordinated Care Services, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$70,000, for trauma informed training for the period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

Per Resolution 6 of 2020, Your Honorable Body accepted a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services for the Finger Lakes Regional Youth Justice Team Grant Program. University of Oklahoma will provide training regarding assessment and treatment for adolescents with sexual behavior problems. Coordinated Care Services, Inc. will provide training, knowledge and capacity around the elements of a traumainformed, culturally informed system, and how that understanding can be applied to their daily practice and organizational culture yielding improved outcomes.

Monroe County's Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise ("M/WBE") Policy is set by the Monroe County Legislature pursuant to Resolution 69 of 1989, as amended by Resolution 240 of 2014. M/WBE utilization was not a selection criteria. The University of Oklahoma was the sole responder for training and assessment for adolescents with sexual behavior problems, but is not listed in New York State's M/WBE Directory of Certified Firms. Coordinated Care Services, Inc. was rated the most qualified to provide trauma informed training, but is not listed in New York State's M/WBE Directory of Certified Firms.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, 865 Research Parkway, Suite 450, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73104 for the Oklahoma Model Treatment Modality Training in the Problematic Sexual Behavior Cognitive Behavior Adolescent Treatment Program in an amount not to exceed \$70,000 for the period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.
- Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments
 thereto, with Coordinated Care Services, Inc., Water Tower Park, 1099 Jay Street, Building J,
 Rochester, New York 14611 for trauma informed training, in an amount not to exceed \$70,000 for
 the period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

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This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for these contracts is included in the 2020 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9300, funds center 2403010000 Probation/Community Corrections Administration. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Coordinated Care Services, Inc. is a not-for-profit agency and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that is does not owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize an intermunicipal agreement with the City of Rochester to allow Rochester Police Department (RPD) Evidence Technicians to enter ballistic imagery into the National Integrated Ballistics Information Network (NIBIN) located at the Monroe County Crime Laboratory (Crime Laboratory) for the period of April 1, 2020 through March 30, 2021, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year periods at Monroe County's discretion.

The Crime Laboratory is a designated NIBIN Site where ballistic imaging equipment is present and must comply with requirements instituted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) for entry of ballistic imaging data. The RPD regularly submits cartridge cases to the Crime Laboratory for entry into the NIBIN database. The County will provide access at the Monroe County Crime Laboratory to at least two (2) RPD Evidence Technicians trained by the ATF on procedures and techniques to enter ballistic imaging data into the NIBIN.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute an intermunicipal agreement, and any amendments thereto, with the City of Rochester to allow Rochester Police Department Evidence Technicians to enter ballistic imagery into the National Integrated Ballistics Information Network located at the Monroe County Crime Laboratory for the period of April 1, 2020 through March 30, 2021, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year periods at Monroe County's discretion.

Mainframe Reconstruction Project

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body designate Monroe County as Lead Agency for the Jail Mainframe Reconstruction Project and determine whether the action may have a significant adverse impact on the environment pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA).

The jail mainframe was originally constructed in 1968 and is approximately 270,000 square feet. Many of the systems in the jail mainframe are original and beyond their useful life. There have also been recent changes in State Legislation such as bail reform, centralized arraignment and Raise the Age. These potential physical limitations and regulatory requirements, as well as recent public health issues such as COVID-19, in addition to a renewed national focus on social justice, drive the need to ensure that outdated facilities do not limit the ability of the Sheriff's Office to adapt and align incarceration and criminal justice programming with the changes in State Legislation.

This project will progress through several phases, commencing with a pre-planning effort, which will assess physical and programmatic needs, population projections, and stakeholder requirements. Upon acceptance by the Sheriff's Office of a conceptual plan for Jail Mainframe Reconstruction, facilities, design, construction, commissioning and occupancy will occur.

The Jail Mainframe Reconstruction Project has been preliminarily classified as a Type I action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.4(b)(6)(iv). The SEQRA regulations found at 6 NYCRR Part 617 requires that no agency shall carry out or approve an Action until it has complied with the requirements of SEQRA.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with LaBella Associates, D.P.C., in the amount of \$217,795, for professional design services for the Jail Mainframe Reconstruction Project.

The jail mainframe was originally constructed in 1968. Many of the systems in the jail mainframe are original and beyond their useful life. There have also been recent changes in State Legislation such as bail reform, centralized arraignment and Raise the Age. These potential physical limitations and regulatory requirements, as well as recent public health issues such as COVID-19, in addition to a renewed national focus on social justice, drive the need to ensure that outdated facilities do not limit the ability of the Sheriff's Office to adapt and align incarceration and criminal justice programming with the changes in State Legislation. Your Honorable Body approved the capital project entitled Jail Mainframe Reconstruction per Resolution 254 of 2019.

This project will progress through several phases, commencing with a pre-planning effort, which will assess physical and programmatic needs, population projections, and stakeholder requirements. Upon acceptance by the Sheriff's Office of a conceptual plan for Jail Mainframe Reconstruction, facilities, design, construction, commissioning and occupancy will occur. This phase of the project will involve the development of a needs assessment, project definition, stakeholder engagement, an implementation plan, site review processes and preparation of conceptual plans. LaBella Associates, D.P.C. proposes to provide basic design services for this phase in the amount of \$217,795.

Monroe County's Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise ("M/WBE") Policy is set by the Monroe County Legislature pursuant to Resolution 69 of 1989, as amended by Resolution 240 of 2014. M/WBE utilization was a selection criteria. None of the three (3) respondents were a M/WBE certified firm, but each respondent's project team included both Women and Minority Owned Business Enterprises. Accordingly, all three (3) respondents scored a two (2) for M/WBE utilization. LaBella Associates, D.P.C., which was rated the most qualified to provide these services, will partner with the following M/WBE certified firms pursuant to this contract: Ravi Engineering & Land Surveying, P.C., Popli Design Group, D2D Green Architecture, PLLC, and Environmental Design & Research, Landscape Architecture, Engineering & Environmental Services, D.P.C.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract with LaBella Associates, D.P.C., 300 State Street, Suite 201, Rochester, New York 14614, in the amount of \$217,795 for professional design services for the Jail Mainframe Reconstruction Project, and any amendments necessary to complete the project within the total capital fund(s) appropriation.

The provisions of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act shall be complied with prior to Your Honorable Body undertaking, funding, or approving the action requested in this referral.

Funding for this contract, consistent with authorized uses, is included in capital fund 1940 and any capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

The records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that neither LaBella Associates, D.P.C., nor any of its principal officers, owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes. The principal officers of the firm are:

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend the 2020-2025 Capital Improvement Program and the 2020 Capital Budget to add a project entitled "Monroe Community College Combined Heat and Power Plant Improvements," in the amount of \$1,300,000; and authorize financing for the project in the amount of \$1,300,000.

The Combined Heat and Power ("CHP") Plant, also known as a Cogen Plant, was constructed at Monroe Community College's Brighton Campus in 2003. Major components of the CHP, specifically the generators, are at approximately fifty percent of their useful life. Comprehensive overhauls are required to ensure continued reliable operation of the electrical generation equipment. In addition, the supervisory control and data acquisition system is obsolete, with hardware components no longer being manufactured. Improvements will include upgrades to the electronic modular control panels, switchgear upgrades, equipment monitoring hardware, engine and generator overhauls, inspections, testing and commissioning.

Partial reimbursement for project costs will be provided by SUNY and partial reimbursement for annual debt service will be provided by Monroe Community College.

This project is scheduled to be considered by the Monroe County Planning Board on October 29, 2020.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Amend the 2020-2025 Capital Improvement Program to add a project entitled "Monroe Community College Combined Heat and Power Plant Improvements," in the amount of \$1,300,000.
- 2. Amend the 2020 Capital Budget to add a project entitled "Monroe Community College Combined Heat and Power Plant Improvements," in the amount of \$1,300,000.
- 3. Authorize financing for the project entitled "Monroe Community College Combined Heat and Power Plant Improvements," in the amount of \$1,300,000.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Goodwill of the Finger Lakes, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$128,085, for COVID-19 call center and phone triage database support services for the Monroe County Department of Public Health, for the period of October 16, 2020 through October 15, 2021, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, in an amount not to exceed \$128,085 annually.

This contract will support the Monroe County COVID-19 hotline phone number. Goodwill of the Finger Lakes, Inc. will provide COVID-19 Call Center services twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week for the Monroe County Department of Public Health. These services include responding to questions, making referrals to other agencies or websites for assistance, and facilitating service escalation for immediate clinical input or to the Monroe County Department of Public Health's phone triage database.

A Request for Proposals was issued for this contract with Goodwill of the Finger Lakes, Inc. the sole responder.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute the contract, and any amendments thereto, with Goodwill of the Finger Lakes, Inc., 422 S. Clinton Avenue, Rochester, New York 14620, for COVID-19 Call Center and phone triage database support services for the Monroe County Department of Public Health, in an amount not to exceed \$128,085, for the period of October 16, 2020 through October 15, 2021, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, in an amount not to exceed \$128,085 annually.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2020 operating budget of the Department of Finance, general fund 9001, funds center 1209070100, State of Emergency and the 2020 operating budget of the Department of Public Health, general fund 9300, funds center 5801090000, Public Health Preparedness. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Goodwill of the Finger Lakes, Inc. is a not-for-profit entity, and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that it does not owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.

ENACTING A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE MONROE COUNTY CHARTER TO CREATE A DEPARTMENT OF DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

Section 1. The Monroe County Charter is amended by adding a new Section C6-26 to read as follows:

Section C6-26. Department of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

- A. Office established: Director. There shall be a Department of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, the head of which shall be the Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Chief Diversity Officer.
- B. Powers and duties. The Director Chief Diversity Officer shall have the following powers and duties:
 - (1) In conjunction with the Director of Human Resources, to develop, implement, maintain and enforce policies, programs and initiatives that foster diversity, equity and inclusion within the County workforce.
 - (2) In conjunction with the Director of Human Resources, to supervise equal employment opportunity functions, including but not limited to developing and administering EEO trainings, and monitoring compliance with federal, state and local equal employment laws, rules and regulations.
 - (3) To investigate, or cause to be investigated, internal complaints of discrimination, harassment, hostile work environment and unequal treatment arising out of any employment or contractual relationship with the County, in accordance with federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations, and County policies.
 - (4) To provide technical advice and guidance on effective methods and procedures for recruitment, selection, placement and promotion of racial and ethnic minorities, women, veterans, persons who identify as LGBTQ, and persons with disabilities.
 - (5) To ensure that the County is in compliance with all applicable requirements and obligations under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act (ADAA) and attendant regulations.
 - (6) To evaluate, develop and strengthen affirmative action programs to achieve diversity outcomes.
 - (7) To work in conjunction with other departments to monitor and certify compliance with federal, state and local purchasing and contracting affirmative action requirements.

- (8) To develop processes that promote equity and inclusion in the award of County contracts and oversee the Minority/Women-owned Business Enterprises (MWBE) selection procedure.
- (9) To provide an annual report to the County Executive of the activities and outcomes of the Department of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.
- (10) To perform such other duties as may be required by the Administrative Code and other laws, and as the County Executive may prescribe.
- Section 2. Section C6-7(10) of the Monroe County Charter is amended to read as follows:
 - (10) In conjunction with the Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Chief Diversity
 Officer, to To supervise equal opportunity functions.
- Section 3. Section 8-3(A) of the Monroe County Code, Administrative Local Laws is amended to read as follows:
- A. Any Monroe County employee may in good faith provide information in any matter involving illegal activity or misconduct to:
 - (1) The County Executive;
 - (2) The County Personnel Director;
 - (3) The Controller;
 - (4) The County Attorney;
 - (5) The District Attorney,
 - (6) The President of the County Legislature; or
 - (7) The Director of the Office of Public Integrity; or
 - (8) The Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Chief Diversity Officer.

Section 4. Section C2-6(C)(9) of the Monroe County Charter is amended to read as follows:

- (9) To confirm appointments of the County Executive to the positions of Director of Public Safety, Director of Public Health, Director of Parks, Executive Health Director of Monroe Community Hospital, Director of Transportation, Director of Aviation, Director of Office of Public Integrity, Director of Office for Veterans' Services, <u>Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion – Chief Diversity Officer</u>, and Director of Human and Health Services in accordance with the procedures set forth in § A4-3 of the Administrative Code.
- Section 5. Severability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.
- Section 6. This local law shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Monroe County Charter.

Subject to the conditions set forth in § C2-2A(3)(b) and (c), all Legislators shall be elected for a term of four years at the general election to be held in the year 2015, and all Legislators shall be elected for a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2019, and all Legislators shall be elected for a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2021. The term of office for all members of the County Legislature set forth in this § C2-2D shall terminate on the 31st day of December in the year 2021 and thereafter the term of office for all members of the County Legislature, beginning with the general election to be held in the year 2021, shall be in accordance with the plan set forth in § C2-2D.

Section 2. This local law is subject to permissive referendum and shall take effect in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Monroe County Charter.

Honorable Legislators:

. I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize the implementation of a Project Labor Agreement ("PLA") for the Rochester Pure Waters District's ("District") Frank E. Van Lare Water Resource Recovery Facility ("FEV WRRF") Capital Improvements Project.

The District owns, operates and maintains the FEV WRRF located at 1574 Lake Shore Boulevard in the City of Rochester. Overall project construction for the FEV Capital Improvements Project will consist of primarily three (3) separate construction contracts: FEV WRRF Aeration System Improvements, Phase B; FEV WRRF Secondary Clarifier Improvements, Phase 2; and FEV WRRF Electrical System Improvements. The proposed improvements total approximately \$45 million and will be constructed over the next seven years.

A PLA will serve the objectives to provide uniform work conditions, cost savings, maximum labor-management harmony, and comprehensive protection against work disruptions arising out of labor disputes. An economic benefits analysis performed by Seeler Engineering, P.C. indicates that the PLA for the project may result in an estimated labor cost savings of \$251,100 which is 4.4% of the estimated project labor cost. The benefits of such an agreement are outlined in the final Benefits Analysis Report which is on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Monroe County Legislature.

The terms of the PLA have been negotiated with the union trades by Monroe County, Seeler Engineering, P.C. and the project construction manager, The Pike Group. The PLA will be executed between The Pike Group, as construction manager, and the union trades. Monroe County negotiated and implemented PLAs for the O'Rorke Bridge Project in 2000, the Monroe Community College Building 9 Expansion and Renovation Project in 2007, the Monroe County Public Safety Laboratory Project in 2009, the Monroe Community College Downtown Campus in 2015 and the Modernization and Revitalization of Terminal Facilities at the Greater Rochester International Airport in 2017.

The specific Administrative Board actions required are:

1. Authorize the implementation of a Project Labor Agreement for the benefit of the Frank E. Van Lare Water Resource Recovery Facility Capital Improvements Project.

RE: Enact a Local Law Entitled, "Amending Monroe County Charter Relating to Term of Office of Members of County Legislature"

Honorable Legislators:

This Honorable Body last revised legislative district boundaries and defined the length of terms of office for the Monroe County Legislature in 2011. The terms of office set as part of Local Law No. 7 of 2011 expire on December 31, 2021. Under normal circumstances, newly defined terms of office and revised legislative district boundaries would be presented jointly following the work on the Legislative District Revision Committee. As many in this Honorable Body are aware, the appointment of the Legislative District Revision Committee is legally tied to the publication of the results of the regular federal census.

Although the U.S. Census Bureau recently stated it is taking steps to meet the statutory deadline of December 31, 2020, reapportionment data may not be available until the second quarter of 2021. The timeline for the release of reapportionment data coupled with the New York State Political Calendar, which likely will call for the circulation of designating petitions to begin sometime in February 2021, makes it impossible for new legislative district boundaries to be viable for the general election to be held in the year 2021.

Despite this Honorable Body's inability to revise legislative district boundaries, we must adjust the length of terms of office for the Monroe County Legislature as defined in Section C2-2(D) of the Monroe County Charter. The Majority believes the most practical approach is to amend the existing term of office structure so all Legislators shall be elected to a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2021. An additional two-year term will allow for revision of legislative district boundaries to take place once the reapportionment data becomes available, and for the newly defined legislative district boundaries to be in effect for the general election to be held in the year 2023.

Additionally, adding a new two-year term of office will allow this Honorable Body to later set new terms of office for the traditional ten-year cycle. This will avoid the perpetual timing issue that will exist into the future. Although the COVID-19 pandemic contributed to the expected delay

in the availability of reapportionment data, it likely still would have been impossible for this Honorable Body to revise legislative district boundaries in time for the circulation of designating petitions even if the data was not delayed.

By looking at the timeline for past Legislative District Revision Commissions, it's clear there would not be sufficient time to revise legislative district boundaries even if apportionment data was made available at the December 31st statutory deadline. The 2011 Legislative District Revision Commission was appointed on February 1, 2011. However, the local law defining the terms of office and revising the legislative district boundaries became effective on May 26, 2011. Although the nearly four-month timeline was suitable based on the 2011 New York State Political Calendar, it would not be viable under the new Political Calendar that is predicated on consolidated Federal and State Primary Election dates.

Therefore, I recommend this Honorable Body enact the attached local law, thereby amending Section C2-2(D) of the Monroe County Charter to add that all Legislators shall be elected to a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2021.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Schedule and hold a public hearing on the proposed Local Law.
- 2. Enact a Local Law to amend the Monroe County Charter relating to the term of office of members of the County Legislature.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This proposal will require no additional net County support in the current Monroe County budget.

This Honorable Body last revised legislative district boundaries and defined the length of terms of office for the Monroe County Legislature in 2011. The terms of office set as part of Local Law No. 7 of 2011 expire on December 31, 2021. Under normal circumstances, newly defined terms of office and revised legislative district boundaries would be presented jointly following the work on the Legislative District Revision Committee. As many in this Honorable Body are aware, the appointment of the Legislative District Revision Committee is legally tied to the publication of the results of the regular federal census.

Although the U.S. Census Bureau recently stated it is taking steps to meet the statutory deadline of December 31, 2020, reapportionment data may not be available until the second quarter of 2021. The timeline for the release of reapportionment data coupled with the New York State Political Calendar, which likely will call for the circulation of designating petitions to begin sometime in February 2021, makes it impossible for new legislative district boundaries to be viable for the general election to be held in the year 2021.

Despite this Honorable Body's inability to revise legislative district boundaries, we must adjust the length of terms of office for the Monroe County Legislature as defined in Section C2-2(D) of the Monroe County Charter. The Majority believes the most practical approach is to amend the existing term of office structure so all Legislators shall be elected to a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2021. An additional two-year term will allow for revision of legislative district boundaries to take place once the reapportionment data becomes available, and for the newly defined legislative district boundaries to be in effect for the general election to be held in the year 2023.

Additionally, adding a new two-year term of office will allow this Honorable Body to later set new terms of office for the traditional ten-year cycle. This will avoid the perpetual timing issue that will exist into the future. Although the COVID-19 pandemic contributed to the expected delay

in the availability of reapportionment data, it likely still would have been impossible for this Honorable Body to revise legislative district boundaries in time for the circulation of designating petitions even if the data was not delayed.

By looking at the timeline for past Legislative District Revision Commissions, it's clear there would not be sufficient time to revise legislative district boundaries even if apportionment data was made available at the December 31st statutory deadline. The 2011 Legislative District Revision Commission was appointed on February 1, 2011. However, the local law defining the terms of office and revising the legislative district boundaries became effective on May 26, 2011. Although the nearly four-month timeline was suitable based on the 2011 New York State Political Calendar, it would not be viable under the new Political Calendar that is predicated on consolidated Federal and State Primary Election dates.

Therefore, I recommend this Honorable Body enact the attached local law, thereby amending Section C2-2(D) of the Monroe County Charter to add that all Legislators shall be elected to a term of two years at the general election to be held in the year 2021.

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Canal Corporation in the amount of \$38,400 for the New York State Canal Corporation (NYSCC) Marine Patrol Matching Grant Program, for the period of April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021.

This grant will provide funds for the dedication of extra law enforcement patrols along the Erie Canal and Canal Way Trail in Monroe County. In the past, NYSCC funded New York State Police patrols in that area; however, nine years ago the New York State Police suspended all dedicated marine patrol in the state. Therefore, NYSCC made the funds available to locally-administered police agencies. This money will be used to fund overtime for those deputies assigned to patrol the Erie Canal and Canal Way Trail. This will be the ninth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding is an increase of \$640 from last year.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize the implementation of a Project Labor Agreement ("PLA") for the Rochester Pure Waters District's ("District") Frank E. Van Lare Water Resource Recovery Facility ("FEV WRRF") Capital Improvements Project.

The District owns, operates and maintains the FEV WRRF located at 1574 Lake Shore Boulevard in the City of Rochester. Overall project construction for the FEV Capital Improvements Project will consist of primarily three (3) separate construction contracts: FEV WRRF Aeration System Improvements, Phase B; FEV WRRF Secondary Clarifier Improvements, Phase 2; and FEV WRRF Electrical System Improvements. The proposed improvements total approximately \$45 million and will be constructed over the next seven years.

A PLA will serve the objectives to provide uniform work conditions, cost savings, maximum labor-management harmony, and comprehensive protection against work disruptions arising out of labor disputes. An economic benefits analysis performed by Seeler Engineering, P.C. indicates that the PLA for the project may result in an estimated labor cost savings of \$251,100 which is 4.4% of the estimated project labor cost. The benefits of such an agreement are outlined in the final Benefits Analysis Report which is on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Monroe County Legislature.

The terms of the PLA have been negotiated with the union trades by Monroe County, Seeler Engineering, P.C. and the project construction manager, The Pike Group. The PLA will be executed between The Pike Group, as construction manager, and the union trades. Monroe County negotiated and implemented PLAs for the O'Rorke Bridge Project in 2000, the Monroe Community College Building 9 Expansion and Renovation Project in 2007, the Monroe County Public Safety Laboratory Project in 2009, the Monroe Community College Downtown Campus in 2015 and the Modernization and Revitalization of Terminal Facilities at the Greater Rochester International Airport in 2017.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the implementation of a Project Labor Agreement for the benefit of the Frank E. Van Lare Water Resource Recovery Facility Capital Improvements Project.
- 2. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to take such necessary action as is required to ensure that the work on the Frank E. Van Lare Water Resource Recovery Facility Capital Improvements Project are carried out in accordance with the terms of the Project Labor Agreement and, in the event of a court order prohibiting the implementation of the Project Labor Agreement, to take such action as is necessary to progress the work without delay, including the letting of further or additional contracts necessary to complete the project.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This Project Labor Agreement will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

Honorable Legislators:

COVID-19 presented a myriad of challenges and unanticipated costs for local governments. Earlier this year, this Honorable Body accepted \$129+ million in federal funding under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act in order to cover many of the costs related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This funding has helped support nearly every County department, and by extension, our entire community.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, this Honorable Body has been looking for innovative ways to make sure taxpayers are protected and supported. This includes making sure that regular government programs and operations are sustained while holding the line on property taxes and other fees and surcharges. To support this effort, this Honorable Body unanimously approved legislation authorizing intermunicipal agreements to use CARES Act funding to support local government units such as the City of Rochester, local towns and villages, and fire and school districts. To date no agreements have been executed despite requests from municipalities.

In the interest of legislative oversight, there have been numerous requests for tracking and reporting of expenses charged to CARES Act funding with limited response. As we approach the end of the life for this funding on December 30, 2020, it is imperative to thoroughly review the utilization of this funding with scrutiny, especially as there are many entities in our community that continue to seek support from the County. Though the County Executive has significant latitude to spend CARES Act funds without legislative approval, this is the taxpayer's money, and transparency should be paramount.

Therefore, I urge this Honorable Body to adopt a resolution that would require weekly legislative notification detailing charges against CARES Act funding received as part of resolution 134 of 2020. This notification should be prompt and thoroughly describe the specific amount of expenditure, a detailed description of the procured item(s) or service(s) as well as the name of the entity receiving the funding. This information is critical because these funds must be utilized by December 30, 2020 or returned to the U.S. Department of the Treasury. It should also be noted the

funds may not be utilized to stockpile materials or utilize services delivered after December 30, 2020.

The specific legislative action required is to amend Section 2 of Resolution 134 of 2020 to require the County Executive or his designee to file weekly reports with the Legislature detailing any expenses, charges, appropriations, encumbrances, commitments, postings, or transfers within general fund 9001, funds center 1209070100, State of Emergency.
