Authorize Federal Equitable Sharing Agreements with the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of the Treasury

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of District Attorney Sandra Doorley and Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize Federal Equitable Sharing Agreements with the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of the Treasury for participation by the Monroe County District Attorney's Office and the Monroe County Sheriff's Office in the federal equitable sharing programs for federally forfeited cash, property, and proceeds obtained in the course of joint law enforcement investigations and prosecutions for the period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

In an effort to further encourage cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies and to deter criminal activity by depriving criminals of property used or acquired through illegal activities, the United States Congress provided the Secretary of the Treasury and the United States Attorney General with the authority to share federally forfeited cash, property, and proceeds with participating federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. The shared funds, property and proceeds must be used for law enforcement purposes. This will be the 31st year the County has participated in this program.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute Federal Equitable Sharing Agreements with the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of the Treasury for participation in federal equitable sharing programs for federally forfeited cash, property, and proceeds obtained in the course of joint law enforcement investigations and prosecutions for the period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

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This is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

These agreements are revenue generating and no net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

Acceptance of a Grant from the United States Department of Homeland Security – Homeland Security Investigations – Rochester Division for State and Local Overtime

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the United States Department of Homeland Security – Homeland Security Investigations – Rochester Division ("HSI") in an amount not to exceed \$30,300 for the reimbursement of overtime for HSI Rochester Investigations for the period of January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022.

The grant will reimburse a portion of the overtime costs associated with a Sergeant and four (4) Deputies assigned to a HSI Rochester Investigations. This will be the second year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents an increase of \$22,300 from last year.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$30,300 and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the United States Department of Homeland Security Homeland Security Investigations Rochester Division for the reimbursement of overtime for HSI Rochester Investigations for the period of January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022.
- 2. Amend the 2022 operating budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$30,300 into general fund 9300, funds center 3803010000, Police Bureau Administration.
- 3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

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4. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant is 100% funded by the United States Department of Homeland Security – Homeland Security Investigations. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable action by Your Honorable Body.
