Subject: Amend Resolution 288 of 2022 as Amended by Resolution 305 of 2024 to Increase the Contract with Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. for Security Services to be Provided at Various Monroe County Facilities and Programs

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 288 of 2022 as amended by Resolution 305 of 2024 to increase the contract with the Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. for security services to be provided at various Monroe County facilities and programs from an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to an amount not to exceed \$5,600,000 for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, with increases for each renewal subject to the applicable New York State Prevailing Wage.

This existing contract supports the mission of the Monroe County Department of Public Safety, Division of Safety and Security Division, which is to provide a safe environment for all staff and visitors at County facilities and for County programs. Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. currently provides unarmed, uniformed guard services; access control; lobby patrols; fire and life safety; control center operations; emergency response; mobile patrols; training for Monroe County Department of Public Safety staff and partners; and other related projects and activities as determined by the County's Safety and Security Administrator.

A Request for Proposals was issued for this contract and Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. was selected as the most qualified to provide the services.

The specific legislative action required is to amend Resolution 288 of 2022 as amended by Resolution 305 of 2024 to increase the contract with Securitas Security Services USA, Inc., 1080 University Avenue, Rochester, New York 14607, for security services to be provided at various Monroe County facilities and programs from an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to an amount not to exceed \$5,600,000 for the period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, with increases for each renewal subject to the applicable New York State Prevailing Wage.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2025 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9001, fund center 2409010000, Office of Safety and Security, and will be included in future years' budgets. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

The records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that neither Securitas Security Services USA, Inc., nor its principal officer, Greg Anderson, CEO/President, owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.

AMENDING RESOLUTION 288 OF 2022 AS AMENDED BY RESOLUTION 305 OF 2024 TO INCREASE THE CONTRACT WITH SECURITAS SECURITY SERVICES USA, INC. FOR SECURITY SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED AT VARIOUS MONROE COUNTY FACILITIES AND PROGRAMS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Resolution 288 of 2022, as amended by Resolution 305 of 2024, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with Securitas Security Services USA, Inc. for security services to be provided at various Monroe County facilities and for County programs in an amount not to exceed \$3,706,000 for the period of November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023, with the option to renew for a term from November 1, 2023 to December 31, 2024 in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000, and from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025 in an amount not to exceed \$5,600,000, together with for three (3) two (2) additional one-year terms thereafter with increases for each renewal subject to the applicable New York State Prevailing Wage.

Section 2. Funding for this contract is included in the 2025 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9001, fund center 2409010000, Office of Safety and Security, and will be included in future years' budgets.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect in accordance with Section C2-7 of the Monroe County Charter.

Subject: Enact a Local Law Entitled "Waiver of Residency Requirement for Monroe County Surveyor"

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body enact a local law entitled "Waiver of Residency Requirement for Monroe County Surveyor."

Section 255 of Monroe County's Administrative Law requires the County to employ a Surveyor. The County Surveyor performs a variety of essential duties for the County, including but not limited to reviewing and approving all subdivision maps filed with the Monroe County Clerk; ensuring that County procedures and policies are complied with regarding the acquisition of property and related right-of-way work; and providing advice and technical assistance regarding highway right-of-way and property lines.

Over the course of the past ten months, the Real Property and Human Resources Departments have performed an intensive search for a new County Surveyor as our former County Surveyor has recently retired. This search has included several job postings on the County's website and on other social media and employment-related websites. Additionally, the County issued a Request for Quotation ("RFQ") to over 800 licensed surveyors in New York. This RFQ yielded only one reply, which was from an unqualified respondent.

Despite the aforementioned challenges, the County has recently identified a licensed and qualified surveyor residing in Livingston County who would like to accept the position of Monroe County Surveyor.

The specific legislative action required is:

1. Schedule and hold a public hearing on the proposed Local Law.
2. Enact a Local Law entitled "Waiver of Residency Requirement for Monroe County Surveyor."

LOCAL LAW NO. _____ OF 2026

ENACT A LOCAL LAW ENTITLED “WAIVER OF RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR MONROE COUNTY SURVEYOR”

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

Section 1. A new chapter shall be added as Chapter 393 of the Monroe County Code entitled “Waiver of Residency Requirement for Monroe County Surveyor” and shall read as follows:

§ 1 Definitions. Defined terms used in this local law shall have the same meaning as ascribed to them below:

COUNTY shall mean Monroe County.

SURVEYOR shall mean an individual employed by Monroe County as a Surveyor as that term is used in the Monroe County Administrative Law.

§ 2 Residency Requirement. Public Officers Law § 3, as amended or changed, is hereby amended and superseded in its application to the County as follows: provisions of Public Officers Law § 3, as amended or changed, requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which he or she shall be chosen or in which his or her official functions are required to be exercised, shall not prevent a person from being employed as a Surveyor by the County, provided that such person resides in the County or any adjoining county within New York State.

Section 2. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

Section 3. This local law shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Monroe County Charter.

Subject: Authorize Appropriation Transfers, Amend Resolutions 336 of 2022 as amended by 232 of 2024, 342 of 2022, and 338 of 2024 to Amend Award Amounts, and Subaward Grant and Interagency Agreements pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize appropriation transfers in the amounts of \$471,000 and \$29,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (“ARPA”) funds; amend Resolution 342 of 2022 to decrease the total award amount to the Department of Public Health (Cure Violence) and amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Health, from an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000 to an amount not to exceed \$3,729,000; amend Resolution 338 of 2024 to amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Safety, from an amount not to exceed \$1,610,000 to an amount not to exceed \$1,581,000; and amend Resolution 336 of 2022, as amended by Resolution 232 of 2024, to increase the total award amount to Finger Lakes Performing Provider System, Inc. (“FLPPS”), for the Complex Care Program, and authorize an amendment to the County’s Subaward Grant Agreement with FLPPS to increase the amount of the agreement, from an amount not to exceed \$6,000,000 to an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000.

As Your Honorable Body is aware, Monroe County received \$144,080,127 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds through ARPA. Your Honorable Body previously allocated ARPA funds for a number of projects. ARPA requires that all grant dollars be expended by Monroe County by December 31, 2026, and that any unspent grant dollars be returned to the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Certain subrecipients of ARPA funds from the County have determined that they will be unable to spend and be reimbursed for all allocated funding prior to the December 31, 2026 expenditure deadline, and they have agreed to reductions of the maximum amount of their ARPA agreements to make their excess funding available to another subrecipient in our community to support a critical, ongoing healthcare program.

This Honorable Body enabled the establishment of the pilot Complex Care Program by adopting Resolution 336 of 2022, as amended by Resolution 232 of 2024, authorizing a grant contract with FLPPS using ARPA funds to implement a transformational complex care program in support of skilled nursing facilities and our hospital systems, to place patients from in-patient hospital settings into skilled nursing facilities. This Honorable Body further supported the Complex Care Program by adopting Resolution 91 of 2023, which expanded the Complex Care Program to include the County’s own skilled nursing facility, Monroe Community Hospital (“MCH”), the 18th-largest skilled nursing facility in the United States.

Since its inception, the original implementation of the FLPPS Complex Care Program, known as the Transformational Community Care Coordination Program (“TC3”), has demonstrated meaningful success in improving care transitions from in-patient hospital settings to skilled nursing facilities for medically complex and difficult-to-place patients. During the first round of the program in 2023, participating acute care hospital systems discharged more than 500 patients to skilled nursing facilities. MCH itself accepted more than 50 patients through its participation in the program. The patients served by TC3 were medically ready to discharge from acute care but nonetheless required skilled nursing services, and they may otherwise have experienced prolonged hospital stays due to placement barriers, exacerbating the hospitals’ capacity challenges. Through Resolution 232 of 2024, This Honorable Body allocated additional ARPA funds to the Complex Care Program, which enabled the program to place additional patients.

TC3 provided targeted financial incentives to skilled nursing facilities for admitting cohorts of patients with advanced and complex care needs. These payments helped offset the significant clinical, staffing, and resource demands associated with this population—demands that have historically served as barriers to admission to skilled nursing facilities. By mitigating these financial risks, the program enabled facilities to accept patients who might otherwise have been declined. At a time when skilled nursing facilities have faced sustained financial duress, the TC3 incentives played a critical role in preventing additional financial hardship related to the high costs of caring for medically complex individuals. Overall, the program strengthened our community’s system-wide care coordination, reduced hospital discharge delays, and supported the viability of skilled nursing facilities, while expanding access to appropriate post-acute care for vulnerable patients and making acute care beds available for incoming hospital patients.

Our community’s hospital systems continue to face challenges that the additional ARPA funding for TC3 can help address. The historic 2025–2026 flu season, combined with an influx of patients to skilled nursing facilities after recent weather damage required evacuation of an assisted living facility in our community, in addition to the continuing challenge of discharging medically complex patients from acute care to skilled nursing facilities, has strained the system’s capacity. This additional proposed ARPA funding will permit FLPPS to restart the TC3 program quickly to help reduce strain on our overburdened community healthcare infrastructure by facilitating the placement of patients who no longer need acute, in-patient level of care into skilled nursing facilities in Monroe County.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Authorize an appropriation transfer in an amount of \$471,000 from Department of Public Health, general fund 9301, funds center 5809010000, Epidemiology & Disease Control Admin to Department of Finance, general fund 9301, funds center 1403930104, ARPA Health & Welfare.
2. Authorize an appropriation transfer in an amount of \$29,000 from Department of Public Safety, general fund 9301, funds center 2401010000, Director’s Office to Department of Finance, general fund 9301, funds center 1403930104, ARPA Health & Welfare.
3. Authorize an amendment to Resolution 342 of 2022 to decrease the total award amount to the Department of Public Health (Cure Violence) from an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000 to an amount not to exceed \$3,729,000 and amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Health, from an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000 to an amount not to exceed \$3,729,000.

4. Authorize an amendment to Resolution 338 of 2024 to amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Safety, from an amount not to exceed \$1,610,000 to an amount not to exceed \$1,581,000.
5. Authorize an amendment to Resolution 336 of 2022, as amended by Resolution 232 of 2024, to increase the total award amount to Finger Lakes Performing Provider System, Inc., from an amount not to exceed \$6,000,000 to an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000 for the Complex Care Program, and authorize an amendment to the County's Subaward Grant Agreement with Finger Lakes Performing Provider System, Inc. to increase the amount of the agreement from an amount not to exceed \$6,000,000 to an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000.
6. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of these funds, any returned contractor funds, or any deferred revenue, in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

Section 1. The Controller is hereby authorized to make appropriation transfers totaling \$500,000 as follows:

 - i. Department of Public Health, general fund 9301, funds center 5809010000, Epidemiology & Disease Control Admin, in the amount of \$471,000;
 - ii. Department of Public Safety, general fund 9301, funds center 2401010000, Director's Office, in the amount of \$29,000;
- b. To:
 - i. Department of Finance, general fund 9301, funds center 1403930104, ARPA Health & Welfare, in the amount of \$500,000.

Section 2. The County Legislature hereby amends Resolution 342 of 2022 to decrease the total award amount to the Department of Public Health (Cure Violence), from an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000 to an amount not to exceed \$3,729,000, and to authorize the County Executive to amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Health, from an amount not to exceed \$4,200,000 to an amount not to exceed \$3,729,000.

Section 3. The County Legislature hereby amends Resolution 338 of 2024 to authorize the County Executive to amend the Interagency Agreement for the Department of Public Safety, from an amount not to exceed \$1,610,000 to an amount not to exceed \$1,581,000.

Section 4. Section 1 of Resolution 336 of 2022, as amended by Resolution 232 of 2024, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The County Executive, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with Finger Lakes Performing Provider System (“FLPPS”) in an amount not to exceed ~~\$6,000,000~~ \$6,500,000 pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act (“ARPA”) for a Complex Care Program for a term to commence on or after November 1, 2022 and terminate on or before December 31, 2026.

Section 5. Funding for this grant contract will be included in the 2026 operating budget of the Department of Finance once the appropriation transfers are authorized.

Section 6. The County Executive is hereby authorized to appropriate any subsequent years of these funds, any returned contractor funds, or any deferred revenue, in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.
