Honorable Legislators:

I am pleased to present for your review and approval the proposed 2020 Annual Budget for Monroe County.

This is the fourth budget that I am submitting to you as County Executive and one that I take great pride in presenting to our community. Upon taking office, I made a promise to the residents, families, and businesses of Monroe County that I would never raise the County property tax rate. One year ago, we passed the first property tax rate cut in a decade, and this year, I am proud that we are doing it again. Our 2020 Budget cuts the tax rate to \$8.79 per \$1,000 of equalized full value – another ten-cent reduction in the County's property tax rate, which will result in over \$4.6 million in savings for our taxpayers. Altogether, the two tax rate cuts will put almost \$9 million back in the pockets of County taxpayers. I appreciate your partnership in helping to deliver even better budgets for our taxpayers and their families.

The 2020 budget is balanced and fiscally responsible and makes County government more efficient, more sustainable, and more accountable than ever before. It limits mandated and non-mandated spending growth to less than the rate of inflation, responsibly funds the vital services that contribute to our world-class quality of life, and continues to provide key investments to support stronger families across Monroe County. This budget is fully in compliance with both the Monroe County's Taxpayer Protection Act and the New York State Property Tax Cap. Operating Budget spending totals approximately \$1.3 billion.

As part of our commitment to growing more jobs for Monroe County residents, we will invest almost \$2.4 million in our Planning and Economic Development initiatives in the coming year. We are again fully-funding our efforts to connect people with more jobs, to give local workers the skills they need to succeed, and to attract new employers and investment to Monroe County. This commitment is reflected in our next-generation approach to economic development. Today, our integrated economic development strategy is about getting boots on the ground, meeting with employers face to face, and sealing the deal when the time comes. There's no question that our County will be open for business in the coming year and for years to come.

Through a combination of dissolving Local Development Corporations (LDCs), controlling local spending, and the continued streamlining of County services, the 2020 Budget holds taxpayer supported non-mandated spending – or the spending that we can control on a local level – below the rate of inflation. Furthermore, budgeted spending on mandated and non-mandated services is well within the rate of inflation, the long-term mandate-driven structural deficit is reduced, and quality of life services are responsibly funded.

Mandated costs continue to make up the single largest portion of the 2020 Budget, comprising 85% of Monroe County's spending for the coming year. Facing this staggering reality, it remains clear that New York State must take responsibility for its mandated programs and spending in order to provide real, lasting relief for property taxpayers. I will continue to work collaboratively with my partners in County government from across the state through my position on the Board of the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) to advocate for reforms to the nine mandated programs and services that still account for 99% of all property taxes collected statewide.

I am proud that my proposed 2020 Monroe County Budget will deliver the second consecutive tax rate cut for our hardworking taxpayers while continuing to fund our vital investments in growing more jobs and supporting stronger families across our community. I look forward to working with you throughout the budget approval process, and I thank you in advance for your continued partnership and support in the year to come.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Pursuant to Section C4-3 of the Monroe County Charter, schedule a public hearing on the 2020 Monroe County Budget and direct the Clerk of the Legislature to cause notice of said public hearing to be published at least once in one or more daily newspapers of general circulation in the County at least five (5) days before the date of said hearing and to cause a summary of said budget, as attached hereto, to be published with said notice.
- Pursuant to Section C4-4 of the Monroe County Charter, adopt the Monroe County 2020 Budget after said public hearing having been held.
- 3. Establish the 2020 Classification, Compensation and Salary Schedule for employees of the County of Monroe, as contained in the 2020 Monroe County Budget.

I recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

Capital Budget and Bond Resolution 13 of 2019 to Provide an Increase in Funding

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body approve a request for Increase and Improvement of Facilities in the Rochester Pure Waters District (District), in the amount of \$6,000,000, consisting of the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements" project, amend the 2019 Capital Budget and Bond Resolution 13 of 2019 to provide an increase in funding.

The total Increase and Improvement of Facilities in the District is comprised of the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements" project (\$6,000,000), and the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Electrical System Improvements" project (\$14,000,000), for a total estimated cost of the Increase and Improvement of Facilities in the amount of \$20,000,000. The above projects are under consideration by Your Honorable Body as companion referrals.

This increase and improvement of facilities is necessary to provide additional funding for continuation of the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements" project. This project includes phased repair and replacement of the secondary clarifiers, including complete replacement of the internal mechanical systems and waste-activated sludge pumping system of each clarifier and associated upgrades to the electrical system and related site improvements. This project may be designed and documented as a green project and as a potential candidate for green bond financing.

The estimated cost of the improvements is \$11,000,000, with \$5,000,000 previously authorized. The actual debt service obligation for the additional cost of the project, \$6,000,000, as projected in future years, could potentially result in an increase of \$2.72 to the future annual charges of the average District ratepayer. However, the actual impact is typically reduced through retirement of previous debt and other offsets to the District's capital charge levy. Based on an average water consumption of 60,000 gallons, the total annual charge for both operation & maintenance and capital to the typical District ratepayer in 2019 is \$235.70.

Portions of the project may become eligible for financing through the New York State Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund amongst other funding sources. It is therefore requested that the County have the ability to submit applications and take any necessary steps to utilize these financing vehicles if they become available.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Rescind Resolution 184 of 2019 and Bond Resolution 185 of 2019.
- 2. Hold a Public Hearing for the proposed maximum amount to be expended for an "Increase and Improvement of Facilities in the Rochester Pure Waters District."
- 3. Following the Public Hearing, adopt a resolution approving the "Increase and Improvement of Facilities in the Rochester Pure Waters District" at the maximum amount to be expended.
- 4. Amend the 2019 Capital Budget to increase funding for the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements" project in the amount of \$6,000,000 from \$5,000,000 to \$11,000,000, for a total authorization of \$11,000,000.
- 5. Amend Bond Resolution 13 of 2019 to increase the total estimated project cost and financing for the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements" project, capital fund 1891, in the amount of \$6,000,000 from \$5,000,000 to \$11,000,000, for a total project authorization of \$11,000,000, subject to the approval of the State Comptroller, if required.
- 6. Authorize filing of applications and execution of Project Financing Agreements and any other necessary documents by the County Executive or the Director of Finance Chief Financial Officer, as appropriate, for participation in federal or New York State subsidized loan programs to finance all or a portion of the project.

Environmental assessments were completed for this action and it was determined that there would be no significant effect on the environment.

Funding for this project, consistent with authorized uses, will be available in capital fund 1891 once the additional financing authorization requested herein is approved and in any other capital fund(s) created for the same intended purpose. The local funding for this project will ultimately be provided by Pure Waters District user fees. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter receive favorable action by Your Honorable Body.

WHEREAS, the Administrative Board of the Rochester Pure Waters District of the County of Monroe, New York has heretofore duly caused to be prepared, pursuant to Section 268 of the County Law, a map and plan by an engineer duly licensed by the State of New York for a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of said District, consisting of the "Frank E. Van Lare Wastewater Treatment Plant Secondary Clarifier Improvements, amend the 2019 Capital Budget and Bond Resolution 13 of 2019 to Provide an Increase in Funding," all as more fully set forth in such map and plan; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature of the County of Monroe has called a public hearing on the aforesaid increase and improvement of facilities in accordance with the provisions of Section 268 of the County Law, and said public hearing held on the _______, at _________P.M. in the Legislative Chambers of the County Office Building, Rochester, New York, in said County; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly published in the manner provided by law and proof thereof has been submitted to said County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, said County Legislature has duly considered the evidence given at said public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:

- Section 1. Resolution 184 of 2019 and Bond Resolution 185 of 2019 are hereby rescinded.
- Section 2. ESTABLISHING SCALE OF CHARGES FOR IRONDEQUOIT BAY SOUTH CENTRAL PURE WATERS DISTRICT, COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT FOR COUNTY OF MONROE, NEW YORK

WHEREAS, the Administrative Board of the Irondequoit Bay South Central Pure Waters District has, pursuant to §266 of the County Law of the State of New York, established a scale of charges for the operation and maintenance of facilities of the District and setting proportionate factors of surcharge for the treatment of industrial wastes and sewerage received by the District; and

WHEREAS, the Administrative Board of the Irondequoit Bay South Central Pure Waters District has, pursuant to §266 of the County Law of the State of New York, and Resolution Nos. 417 and 418 of 1973, and Resolution No. 449 of 1976, called a public hearing, said hearing having been held on the ____ day of December, 2019, at ____ p.m. ET.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PURE WATERS ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF THE IRONDEQUOIT BAY SOUTH CENTRAL PURE WATERS DISTRICT, as follows:

Section 1.

SCALE OF CHARGES

These Scales of Charges shall be effective commencing January 1, 2020.

IRONDEQUOIT BAY SOUTH CENTRAL PURE WATERS DISTRICT Operation and Maintenance Charge

\$1.4525 per 1,000 gallons of water consumption (see Notes 1-3).

Operation and Maintenance Charge for properties Receiving Local Collection System Services

\$2.47 per 1,000 gallons of water consumption (see Notes 1-3).

- This charge is based upon recent historic water consumption reflecting normal domestic waste water. It will be adjusted for industrial and commercial users based on the quality of sewage and additional cost of treatment.
- This charge is subject to change based on financial obligations of the District.
- 3. This charge will be included in the 2020 County Tax Bill as a user charge. Accounts for which water consumption has not been calculated by November 1, 2019 will be billed at 60,000 gallons per unit for the user charge separately commencing January 1, 2020. All such bills unpaid as of October 1st will be transferred to the County Tax Rolls.
- In-District and out-of-District agreements may be developed based on but not limited to loadings
 placed on the total sewerage systems pursuant to the Monroe County Sewer Use Law.

NEW USER CONNECTION FEES

The charges for regulating, permitting and connecting to a public sanitary sewer within the District are based on average costs incurred by the District for such new connections.

The proposed fee schedule for new connections is as follows:

Irondequoit Bay South Central Pure Waters District: \$250.00 per connection - residential \$350.00 per connection - non-residential

SEWER SURCHARGE - APPLICABLE TO ALL DISTRICTS

The owner or lessee of any parcel of real property connected with the District's Sewerage System and discharging any sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes containing acceptable pollutants imparting characteristics that exceed the maximum values established for normal sewage shall be surcharged. The surcharge reimburses the District for increased cost of treating said effluent. The charge shall be arrived at by multiplying the charge for normal sanitary sewage by the surcharge factor. The formula for finding the surcharge factor is as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PURE WATERS ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF THE ROCHESTER PURE WATERS DISTRICT, as follows:

Section 1.

SCALE OF CHARGES

These Scales of Charges shall be effective commencing January 1, 2020.

ROCHESTER PURE WATERS DISTRICT Operation and Maintenance Charge

\$2.4700 per 1,000 Gallons of water consumption (see Notes 1-3).

CHARGES FOR RPWD ZONE 2: No Charge - Operation and Maintenance not provided.

- This charge is based upon recent historic water consumption reflecting normal domestic waste water. It will be adjusted for industrial and commercial users based on the quality of sewage and additional cost of treatment.
- 2. This charge is subject to change based on financial obligations of the District.
- 3. This charge will be included in the 2020 County Tax Bill as a user charge. Accounts for which water consumption has not been calculated by November 1, 2019 will be billed at 60,000 gallons per unit for the user charge separately commencing January 1, 2020. All such bills unpaid as of October 1st will be transferred to the County Tax Rolls.
- 4. In-District and out-of-District agreements may be developed based on but not limited to loadings placed on the total sewerage systems pursuant to the Monroe County Sewer Use Law.

NEW USER CONNECTION FEES

The charges for regulating, permitting and connecting to a public sanitary sewer within the District are based on average costs incurred by the District for such new connections.

The proposed fee schedule for new connections is as follows:

Rochester Pure Waters District: \$300.00 per connection – residential * \$400.00 per connection – non-residential *

SEWER SURCHARGE - APPLICABLE TO ALL DISTRICTS

The owner or lessee of any parcel of real property connected with the District's Sewerage System and discharging any sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes containing acceptable pollutants imparting characteristics that exceed the maximum values established for normal sewage shall be surcharged. The surcharge reimburses the District for increased cost of treating said effluent. The charge shall be arrived at by multiplying the charge for normal sanitary sewage by the surcharge factor. The formula for finding the surcharge factor is as follows:

SS = Milligrams per liter of Suspended Solids, as defined in Section 2.55 of the Monroe County Sewer Use Law.

P = Milligrams per liter of Phosphorus, as defined in Section 2.33 of the Monroe County Sewer Use

Proportionate cost to treat a lb. of Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD) and is established at 0.470.

b = Proportionate cost to treat a lb. of Suspended Solids (SS) and is established at 0.505.

d = Proportionate cost to treat a lb. of Phosphorus (P) and is established at 0.025.
