Re: Prohibiting the Possession of Weapons in Buildings Owned or Operated By the County of Monroe

Honorable Legislators:

As elected representatives for the residents of Monroe County we have an important balancing act to perform. We seek to weigh the public's interest and ability to contact their elected representatives and access County government with the need for all county employees and legislators to be secure in their work locations. We desire a robust interaction with the public that does not stifle the people's ability to obtain county services or speak on matters of public concern. Yet, we also must govern and pass responsible laws that reflect the age we live in and seek to minimize risk for citizens and county employees alike. And, today, few government buildings allow citizens to carry weapons inside.

To that end, in 1991, the County Legislature adopted a local law prohibiting certain deadly weapons in buildings owned or operated by the County of Monroe, except for authorized peace officers and police officers as defined by New York State Criminal Procedure Law. However, this law also allows those who have a lawful permit to possess such weapons, pursuant to Section 400 of New York State Penal Law, to carry them into County owned and operated buildings. This exemption increases the amount of weaponry that can be on County property, therefore increasing the likelihood of a bad situation escalating and turning tragic.

Therefore, we propose that this Honorable Body enact a local law to amend the Monroe County Administrative Code & Charter to prohibit the possession of weapons in buildings owned or operated by the County, except for authorized peace and police officers.

- Schedule and hold a public hearing on this proposed local law. 1.
- Enact a local law amending the Monroe County Administrative Code & Charter, as attached.

This proposed local law shall have no impact on the revenues and/or expense of the current Monroe County Budget.

Honorable Legislators:

Subject: Acceptance of a Grant from the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency (COMIDA), in the amount of \$265,000, for economic development activities, staff services and office expenses, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

These funds will be made available to the Monroe County Department of Planning and Development (MCDPD) to support activities to encourage the growth of jobs and businesses in the County; \$240,000 of these funds will be utilized to support MCDPD staff and programs; \$25,000 will be used for office expense reimbursement. In addition to providing staff services to COMIDA, the MCDPD conducts a Business Outreach Program, provides financial packaging and technical assistance to businesses and municipalities, coordinates planning and employment and training activities, and provides marketing and data to a wide variety of local businesses. This will be the 20th year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents the same amount as last year.

#### The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to accept a \$265,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency, for economic development activities, staff services and office expenses, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.
- 2. Authorize the County Executive to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements and to make any necessary funding modifications within grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

3. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

Funding for this grant is included in the 2013 operating budget of the Department of Planning & Development, fund 9001, funds center 1403010000, Economic Development.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the Monroe County Industrial Development Corporation (MCIDC), in the amount of \$65,000, to support economic development activities in Monroe County, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

These funds will be used to support economic development activities in the County. The Department of Planning and Development provides staff services to MCIDC, conducts a business outreach program, provides financial packaging, technical assistance to businesses and municipalities, and marketing and data to the public. This is the 24<sup>th</sup> year the County has received this grant from MCIDC. This year's funding represents the same amount as last year.

Subject: Authorize a Contract with the Greater Rochester Enterprise for General Operating Expenses

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with the Greater Rochester Enterprise (GRE), in the amount of \$50,000, for the County's share of general operating expenses of the GRE, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

The GRE is a public/private partnership established to professionally market the Rochester Metropolitan Area as a competitive, high profile region for business location and growth. The primary focus of the GRE is on business attraction, including prospect handling and marketing. The GRE will promote Rochester to targeted businesses, encourage existing businesses to retain and expand locally, seize opportunities to attract and retain intellectual capital, and support existing economic development partners. This will be the 11th year the County has contributed to the GRE. This year's funding represents the same amount as last year.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with the Greater Rochester Enterprise, for general operating support, in the amount of \$50,000, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2013 operating budget of the Planning and Development Department, fund 9001, funds center 1403010000, Economic Development. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

The Greater Rochester Enterprise is a not-for-profit agency and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated it does not owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.

Subject: Approve a Public Employees Blanket Bond for the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body approve the Public Employees Blanket Bond as the official undertaking of the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (G/FLRPC).

Monroe County has appropriated the sum of \$29,989 as its share of the 2013 operating funds of the G/FLRPC. In a concurrently submitted referral I am requesting authorization to make the annual contribution. Pursuant to Section 119-00 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, Monroe County is authorized to provide for the payment of such appropriations to an officer of the agency designated by the agency to receive such monies provided that such officer shall have executed an official undertaking approved by the County Legislature. The G/FLRPC has designated David S. Zorn, Executive Director of the Council, as the officer to receive payments of such monies. G/FLRPC has secured a Public Employees Blanket Bond, issued by National Grange Mutual Insurance Company, providing faithful performance blanket bond coverage for officers and employees of the G/FLRPC in the amount of \$500,000 (copy attached). Monroe County must approve such blanket bond as the official undertaking of G/FLRPC.

The specific legislative action required is to approve the Public Employees Blanket Bond for the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council required pursuant to Section 119-00 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York.

This Public Employees Blanket Bond will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize Monroe County's 2013 annual contribution to the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (G/FLRPC) in the amount of \$29,989. This annual contribution is Monroe County's share of the G/FLRPC's operating budget and is based on a formula in the Operating Agreement, which specifies the contribution of each of the nine member counties according to population.

The member counties of the G/FLRPC agree each year on an operating budget for the G/FLRPC. The budget is funded from the county contributions and supplemented with grants for such activities as aviation planning, economic development coordination, and other special projects. This year's contribution is the same amount as last year.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the payment of Monroe County's 2013 contribution to the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council in the amount of \$29,989.

Funding for this contribution is included in the 2013 operating budget of the Planning and Development Department, fund 9001, funds center 1402040000, Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

#### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the Genesee Transportation Council, in the amount of \$15,000, for a Land Use Project, for the period of April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014.

The purpose of this grant is to enable the County to prepare a report on changes in land use in Monroe County and projections of future land use. The information will be used by the Genesee Transportation Council to prepare updated estimates and projections of highway traffic using a computer model. This information will also be of use to the Department of Planning and Development in assessing changes and trends in land use during the year; preparing the Capital Improvement Program; and updating County policies relating to land use and economic development. This is the twenty-first consecutive year the County has received this grant. The amount of the grant is the same as last year.

#### The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to accept a \$15,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the Genesee Transportation Council, for a Land Use Project, for the period of April 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014.
- 2. Authorize the County Executive to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements and to make any necessary funding modifications within grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of District Attorney Sandra Doorley.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, in the amount of \$117,054, for the Motor Vehicle Theft and Insurance Fraud Prosecution Program, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

This grant will fund a portion of the costs of one (1) full-time Assistant District Attorney and one (1) District Attorney Investigator, to coordinate the efforts of the Rochester Police Department, New York State Insurance Department-Insurance Fraud Bureau, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, New York State Police, and other local police agencies in investigating cases involving auto theft, and insurance fraud involving motor vehicles.

The goals of the program include continuing to fully investigate and prosecute all suspected instances of motor vehicle theft in Monroe County, fully investigate and prosecute all individuals who file fraudulent motor vehicle theft claims, strengthening and expanding the information-sharing protocols among the various local police and State agencies investigating such crimes that were established during the program's first year, and to increase the arrest and conviction rate of the perpetrators of such crimes. This will be the tenth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents a decrease of \$25,946 from last year.

## Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize eight (8) additional projects to the approved Passenger Facility Charge Program at the Greater Rochester International Airport, as designated by the Monroe County Airport Authority to enhance capacity, safety, and security of the Airport.

Monroe County has pledged an effort to obtain the maximum financial assistance for improvements at the Airport. Passenger Facility Charges (PFCs) are user fees collected from eligible enplaned passengers utilizing the Greater Rochester International Airport. The Monroe County Airport Authority, by Resolution No. 25 dated November 9, 2005, authorized the continuation of the collection of a \$4.50 Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) on eligible enplaned passengers at the Airport in accordance with Federal Law. The Resolution also authorized the collection and expenditure of the PFC funds on certain projects, all subject to approval by the FAA pursuant to applications submitted by the Authority.

It is anticipated that the Monroe County Airport Authority will adopt a resolution at their meeting scheduled for February 13, 2013, authorizing the Director of Aviation to file a new application with the Federal Aviation Administration authorizing the continuation of the imposition of a \$4.50 PFC, and the expenditure of revenues from the PFC at the Greater Rochester International Airport to be expended for reimbursement of funds for future capital expenditures and financing costs related to the following projects:

- 3. Glycol Recovery Vehicles
- 4a. Terminal Improvements HVAC System Upgrade

## Honorable Legislators:

The Stop Violence Against Women Program enables two (2) Probation Assistant positions who assist victims of domestic violence by preparing legal petitions in Family Court in order to obtain Orders of Protection. The Probation Assistants also connect victims with available advocacy programs and educate victims about available options for dispositions. This program serves in excess of 3,800 victims annually. This is the sixteenth year the county will receive this grant. This year's funding represents a decrease of \$5,989 from last year.

### Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Catholic Family Center, in the amount of \$30,000, for the provision of Girls Circle curriculum to probation-involved youth, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 annually.

The Girls Circle curriculum is a research-based model consisting of a strength-based skill building approach which creates a safe place for girls to address their risky behaviors, build on protective factors and improve relationships. It is recognized as a "promising approach" in the Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) Model Programs Guide. Catholic Family Center will hire a therapist to deliver the curriculum through group and individual sessions, outreach to family, tailoring of service to meet individual client needs and referral and connections with other supportive services in conjunction with a Probation Officer. The Girls Circle curriculum will serve forty (40) probation-involved, adolescent girls. This is the fifth year that this contract is being funded.

A request for qualifications was issued and Catholic Family Center was rated the most qualified to provide this service.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or her designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with Catholic Family Center, 87 North Clinton Avenue, Rochester, New York 14604, for the provision of Girls Circle curriculum to probation-involved youth, in the amount of \$30,000, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, with the option to renew for two (2) additional one-year terms, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 annually.

### Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of District Attorney Sandra Doorley.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, in the amount of \$206,000, to continue the Crimes Against Revenue Prosecution unit in the District Attorney's Office, for the period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

This grant will provide funding to support a portion of the cost of three (3) Assistant District Attorneys, and one (1) Criminal Law Assistant, to both investigate and prosecute those individuals and businesses that operate in Monroe County who violate tax laws, to reclaim revenue lost due to non-compliance with state tax laws, and to increase voluntary compliance with applicable tax laws.
