Enact a Local Law Amending the Monroe County Charter to Change the Date for Filling Vacancies in the Monroe County Legislature

Honorable Legislators:

Honorable Legislators

Monroe County Legislature 407 County Office Building Rochester, NY 14614

I recommend that this Honorable Body enact a local law amending the Section C2-5 (A)(2) of the Monroe County Charter to change the date for filling vacancies in the Monroe County Legislature.

The Charter currently cites September 20th as the threshold date for whether a vacancy will trigger an election during the next general election. This reference is no longer compliant with Section 6-158 of the New York State Election Law, which states "A vacancy occurring three months before the general election in any year in any office authorized to be filled at a general election, except in the offices of governor, lieutenant-governor, or United States senator shall be filled at the general election held next thereafter, unless otherwise provided by the constitution, or unless previously filled at a special election."

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Schedule and hold a public hearing on the proposed Local Law.
- Enact a Local Law to amend the Monroe County Charter to change the date for filling 2. vacancies in the Monroe County Legislature.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Review Act. This local law will have no impact on the current Monroe County budget.

LOCAL LAW NO OF 2020
ENACTING A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE MONROE COUNTY CHARTER TO CHANGE THE DATE FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE, as follows:
Section 1. Section C2-5 A. (2) of the Monroe County Charter is amended to read as follows:
A vacancy in the County Legislature shall be filled by appointment by the President of the County Legislature within 30 days of such vacancy. If such vacancy occurs before September 20 at least three months before the general election in any year, the appointee shall serve for the balance of that year, and a successor shall be elected at the general election held next after the occurrence of such vacancy for the unexpired portion of the term for which such appointment shall have been made or for a full term, as the case may be. If such vacancy occurs on or after September 20 less than three months before the general election in any year, unless the term will expire in the year in which the vacancy occurred, the appointee shall serve until the end of the following year, and a successor shall be elected at the general election held in the year next after the occurrence of such vacancy for the unexpired portion of the term for which such appointment shall have been made or for a full term, as the case may be. If such vacancy occurs on or after September 20 less than three months before the general election and the term expires in the year in which the vacancy occurs, the appointee shall serve for the balance of that year. If no candidate for said office has been duly elected at the general election in the year in which such vacancy occurs, said office shall again be deemed to be vacant as of the first day of January of the next succeeding year. Section 2. This local law shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Monroe County Charter.

Acceptance of a Grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services for

the Livescan Equipment Grant Program

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, in the amount of \$90,000, for the Livescan Equipment Grant Program, for the period of April 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

This grant will fund the partial purchase of Livescan equipment, allowing the Sheriff's Office to replace nine (9) Livescan Units at the following locations: Monroe County Jail, Sheriff A, B, and C Zone, STOP DWI Vans, and Police Records. All of the units are old and outdated. This is the third time the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents an increase of \$80,570 from last year.

The specific legislative actions required are:

- 1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$90,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, for the Livescan Equipment Grant Program, for the period of April 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
- 2. Amend the 2020 operating grant budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$90,000 into general fund 9300, funds center 3806020000, Information Services.
- 3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.

4. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant has a match of \$117,900. This match is included in Capital Fund 1929. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Acceptance of a Grant from the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York for the United States Marshals Service New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force - Rochester Division

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service (USMS) Western District of New York, in an amount not to exceed \$50,000, for the reimbursement of overtime, for the United States Marshals Service New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force - Rochester Division, for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

This grant continues to support the collaborative task force with the USMS to investigate, apprehend and arrest violent felony fugitives. The grant will reimburse a portion of the overtime costs associated with the task force services. This will be the eleventh year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents a \$20,000 increase from last year.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$50,000, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York, for the reimbursement of overtime, for the United States Marshals Service New York/New Jersey Regional Fugitive Task Force - Rochester Division, for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

- 2. Amend the 2020 operating budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$50,000 into general fund 9300, funds center 3803010000, Police Bureau Administration.
- 3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.
- 4. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant is 100% funded by the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with the University of Rochester, in an amount not to exceed \$60,000, for continuing development and sustainment of the County's Medical Countermeasure Program, for the period of July 1, 2020 through March 15, 2021.

This contract will support the County's Medical Countermeasure Program. The University of Rochester will provide: support of exercise and drill development and implementation; communication and information management activities; Monroe County Department of Public Health staff and partner training; and completion of other related projects and activities as determined by the Program Manager of the Office of Public Health Preparedness.

A Request for Qualifications was issued for this contract with the University of Rochester the sole responder.

The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the University of Rochester, 601 Elmwood Avenue, Rochester, New York 14642, for the continuing development and sustainment of the County's Medical Countermeasure Program, in an amount not to exceed \$60,000 for the period of July 1, 2020 through March 15, 2021.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2020 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9300, funds center 2408030100, Office of Emergency Management. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

The University of Rochester is a not-for-profit entity, and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that it does not owe any delinquent Monroe County Property taxes.

Authorize an Undertaking for the New York State Department of Transportation to Allow Future County Utility and Non-Utility Work in State Rights of Way

Honorable Legislators:

To The Honorable

Monroe County Legislature

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize the attached Undertaking for the benefit of the New York State Department of Transportation, in order for Monroe County to obtain Utility and Non-Utility Work Permits to perform work in State rights of way.

The New York State Department of Transportation requires indemnification from entities applying for permits to work within rights-of-way controlled by the State of New York. Access to and operation within a State right-of-way are conditioned upon compliance with Highway Law Sections 52, 103, 203 and/or 234, including requirements that the permittee assume all responsibility for: (a) the temporary control of all modes of traffic (including motorized and non-motorized travel) affected by the permittee's operations; (b) complete restoration of State facilities to their condition prior to the permitted use or activity; and (c) all claims, damages, losses and expenses. Execution of the attached Undertaking will satisfy the State's requirements. This Undertaking shall have a term of twenty (20) years and will be kept on file to facilitate the issuance of future permits on State highways.

Typical examples of County work within State rights-of-way include: expressway highway lighting rehabilitation projects; using State roads as part of a detour; curb radius and pavement work adjacent to a State road; replacement of pavement markings; replacement of traffic signal loops; connecting into a manhole for storm sewer; and any work related to tying County highway work to a State road.

The specific legislative action required is to to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute the attached Undertaking, and any amendments thereto, for the benefit of the New York State Department of Transportation, in order for Monroe County to obtain Utility and Non-Utility Work Permits to perform work in State rights of way.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This action will have no impact on the revenues or expenditures of the current Monroe County budget.

I recommend that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee(s) for favorable actions by Your Honorable Body.

WHEREAS, Permittee's access and operation upon state right-of-way is conditioned upon compliance with Highway Law Sections 52, 103, 203 and/or 234, including the conditions that Permittee assume all responsibility for (a) the temporary control of all modes of traffic (including motorized and non-motorized travel) affected by Permittee's operations, (b) complete restoration of state facilities to their condition prior to permitted use or activity, and (c) all claims, damages, losses and expenses,

NOW, THEREFORE, in relation to all operations and/or actions undertaken within state right-of-way, Permittee hereby agrees to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Permit Applications. Excepting only activities undertaken to protect public safety because of emergency conditions or incidents, Permittee shall provide timely written notice to NYSDOT of operations or activities affecting state right-of-way. Under normal circumstances, a minimum of five business days notice shall be provided. Notification of emergency activities shall be provided to NYSDOT as soon as practicable after the activity. The Permittee shall apply for project-specific permits for activities not allowed under any existing annual permit. Such application shall identify proposed project locations, desired dates/hours, proposed work/activities, traffic control, and site restoration
- 2. Applicable Rules, Regulations & Conditions. Permittee shall comply with all of the laws, rules and regulations applicable to construction, maintenance activities and operations and shall further comply with such terms and conditions that may be imposed by NYSDOT in connection with permitted activity or operations. Temporary Traffic Control, highway safety appurtenances, and restoration of state facilities shall be completed in accordance with NYSDOT regulations and standards.
- 3. Site Restoration. Permittee shall, at its own expense, promptly complete the work allowed under each permit and, within a reasonable time, restore State property damaged by its work/activities to substantially the same or equivalent condition as existed before such work was begun as determined by the Commissioner or his/her designee. In the event that the Permittee fails to so restore damaged State property within what the Commissioner deems to be a reasonable time, the Commissioner, after giving written notice to the Permittee, may restore the property to substantially the same or equivalent condition as existed before the Permittee's work/activities, in which case, Permittee agrees to reimburse the reasonable expenses in connection therewith.

- 4. Payment & Release of Liens. Permittee shall be responsible for the payment of all costs and materials relating to its work in the public right-of-way, and agrees to defend and save harmless NYSDOT against any and all lien claims made by persons supplying services or materials to Permittee in connection with Permittee's work.
- 5. Indemnity. In addition to the protection afforded to NYSDOT under any available insurance, NYSDOT shall not be liable for any damage or injury to the Permittee, its agents, employees, or to any other person, or to any property, occurring on the site or in any way associated with Permittee's activities or operations, whether undertaken by Permittee's own forces or by contractors or other agents working on Permittee's behalf. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Permittee agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State of New York, NYSDOT, and their agents from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including but not limited to, claims for personal injuries, property damage, wrongful death, and/or environmental claims and attorney fees arising out of any such claim, that are in any way associated with the Permittee's, activities or operations under any and all permits issued using this Undertaking.

FURTHERMORE, Permittee hereby warrants that the obligations of this Undertaking are backed by the full faith and credit of Permittee. Permittee may insure or bond any of the obligations set forth herein, or may rely upon self-insurance, budgeted funds, or funds for general operations.

This Undertaking shall be applicable to all permitted activities and operations undertaken after the date of execution and work initiated while this Undertaking is in effect. This Undertaking may be revoked by the Permittee or rejected by NYSDOT upon thirty days written notice but will continue to apply to all permitted activities/operations that were permitted by virtue of this Undertaking. Unless terminated for the purpose of future activities/operations, this Undertaking shall have a term of twenty (20) years and shall be kept on file to facilitate the issuance of future permits to which it will apply.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept an offer of compensation and the corresponding payment, in the amount of \$16,750, for the appropriation by the State of New York of a portion of property owned by Monroe County, having tax map number 150.21-1-2.001, in the City of Rochester for the Mount Hope Avenue Improvement Project. The appropriation consists of the following parcels at 1870 Mount Hope Avenue:

The parcels are 11,726 sq. ft. portion of the 10.36 acre County-owned parcel. The price for these parcels was determined to be market value by Monroe County Real Estate. The land will be used by the State as part of their project to improve Mount Hope Avenue. The acquisitions will accommodate the new improvements for Mount Hope Avenue.

The specific legislative action required is to accept an offer of compensation and corresponding payment, in the amount of \$16,750, from the State of New York for appropriation of the parcels along 1870 Mount Hope Avenue as depicted on Map 63, as Parcels 94, 95 and 151 and identified by tax identification #150.21-1-2.001, to Monroe County, and to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute an agreement and any other documents necessary to accept payment and to release the State from any further claim or interest by the County.

The provisions of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act shall be complied with prior to Your Honorable Body undertaking, funding, or approving the action requested in this referral.

This contract is revenue generating and no net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

Acceptance of a Grant from New York State Office of Mental Health for the PFC Dwyer

Veteran Peer-to-Peer Support Program and Authorize a Contract with Compeer, Inc.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Office of Mental Health, in the amount of \$185,000, for the PFC Dwyer Veteran Peer-to-Peer Support Program, and authorize a contract with Compeer, Inc., in the amount of \$170,000, to provide comprehensive peer-to-peer services, for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

The purpose of this grant is to design, implement and evaluate veteran peer-to-peer programs for veterans who are experiencing post-traumatic stress symptoms. The goals of the program are to provide outreach and education regarding available peer-to-peer counseling. It should also encourage family, friends and community connectedness as well as provide access to suicide prevention/intervention measures. This is the fourth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents the same amount as last year.

Compeer, Inc. will provide an array of services, including one-on-one peer mentoring, group sessions facilitated by peer mentors and licensed therapists as consultants; and enhancement of social networking capabilities, virtual meeting spaces and other technological tools designed to help veterans connect with one another remotely.

A request for proposals was issued with Compeer, Inc. selected as the most qualified to provide this service.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept at \$185,000 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Office of Mental Health, for the PFC Dwyer Veteran Peer-to-Peer Support Program, for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

- 2. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with Compeer, Inc., 259 Monroe Avenue, Rochester, New York 14607, to provide comprehensive peer-to-peer mentoring services for the PFC Dwyer Veteran Peer-to-Peer Support Program, in the amount of \$170,000, for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.
- 3. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to re-appropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, and to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments.
- 4. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to modify or terminate the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c) and is not subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from Health Research, Inc., in the amount of \$105,000, for the Expanded Partner Services Initiative, for the period of April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021.

The purpose of this grant is to conduct activities necessary to follow up on reports of persons living with a diagnosis of HIV infection within Monroe County and thought to be out-of-care. This funding will support the investigation of out-of-care patients; link patients to medical care and other non-medical services, as identified; elicit, notify, and test partners of their potential exposure to HIV; engage patients and named partners in a risk-reduction conversation and provide supplies to prevent the spread of the disease; collect and/or verify identifying and demographic information related to HIV; and complete partner services field investigations. Funds will be used to provide partial funding for salaries and benefits of existing staff. It will also support transportation, software, and interpreting service costs. This will be the eighth year the County has received this grant. This year's funding represents the same amount as last year.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize the acceptance of Regional Council Award Grant Funding from the New York State Urban Development Corporation, doing business as Empire State Development ("ESD"), in the amount of \$1,500,000, for the Frontier Field Improvements project.

Monroe County established a project at Frontier Field to undertake routine structural improvements, equipment upgrades and stadium enhancements. This work was funded by capital fund 1747, approved by Your Honorable Body through Resolutions 305 of 2018 and 61 of 2017. The County applied for, and was selected to receive, an ESD Incentive in the amount of \$1,500,000. The project was consistent with the Finger Lakes Regional Economic Development Council Plan's strategy to support tourism and enhance the region's quality of life. The application for the ESD Incentive was approved by Your Honorable Body through Resolution 256 of 2014. The Department of Environmental Services has completed the work; thereby, allowing the acceptance of the \$1,500,000 grant funding outlined in the ESD Incentive and Grant Disbursement agreement. Work included several structural improvements, equipment upgrades, and stadium enhancements to Frontier Field such as a new sprinkler system, structural steel painting, an upgraded energy management system, new dugout netting, full replacement of the pavilion roof, electrical system upgrades, and replacement of concrete in many areas of the stadium complex.

The specific legislative actions required are:

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with the New York State Urban Development Corporation, doing business as Empire State Development, to accept Regional Council Award Grant Funding, in the amount of \$1,500,000, for the Frontier Field Improvements project.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Bergmann Associates, Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architects & Surveyors, D.P.C., in the amount of \$330,271, for professional design services, for the Monroe Community College (MCC) Property Preservation - Phase III Project.

The Property Preservation - Phase III Project addresses "infrastructure" type projects including the upgrade and modernization of the architectural, structural, site, mechanical, electrical, communication, and plumbing systems throughout all of MCC's campuses. Life safety, code compliance, and accessibility are also addressed, as needed. Current and future comprehensive facilities condition assessments of MCC's campuses are utilized to understand major infrastructure and building issues. Assessment data is analyzed such that top priority is given to infrastructure that has already failed or is expected to fail in the very near future.

Several consultants were considered to provide professional design services, with Bergmann Associates, Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architects & Surveyors, D.P.C. rated the most qualified to provide these services.

This phase of the project involves comprehensive structural improvements to the underground parking garage and pedestrian terrace constructed at street level at the Downtown Campus. Bergmann Associates, Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architects & Surveyors, D.P.C. proposes to provide basic design, special services, and construction inspection in the amount of \$330,271. A cost breakdown of these services is as follows:

(Siemens) from the amount of \$1,251,158 to the amount of \$1,751,158, for the operation and maintenance of Monroe County's Iola cogeneration (Cogen) facility, for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, with all other terms to remain the same.

The increase in funding will allow for amendments necessary within the operating fund(s) appropriation, for the operation and maintenance of Monroe County's Iola Cogeneration Facility.
