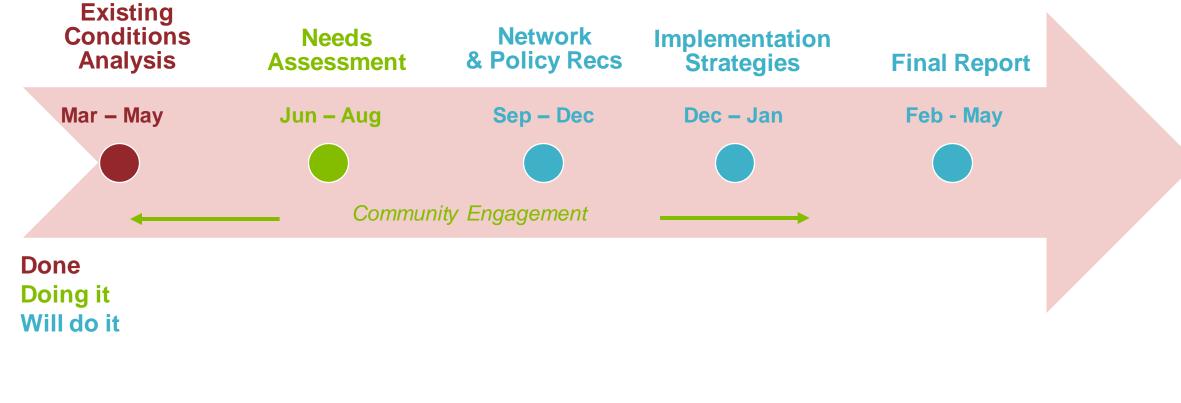

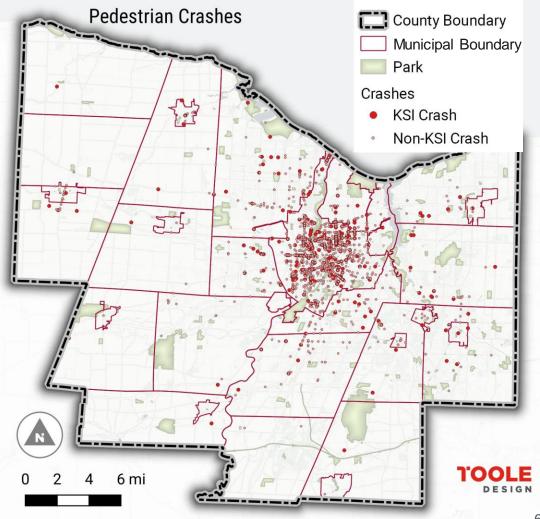






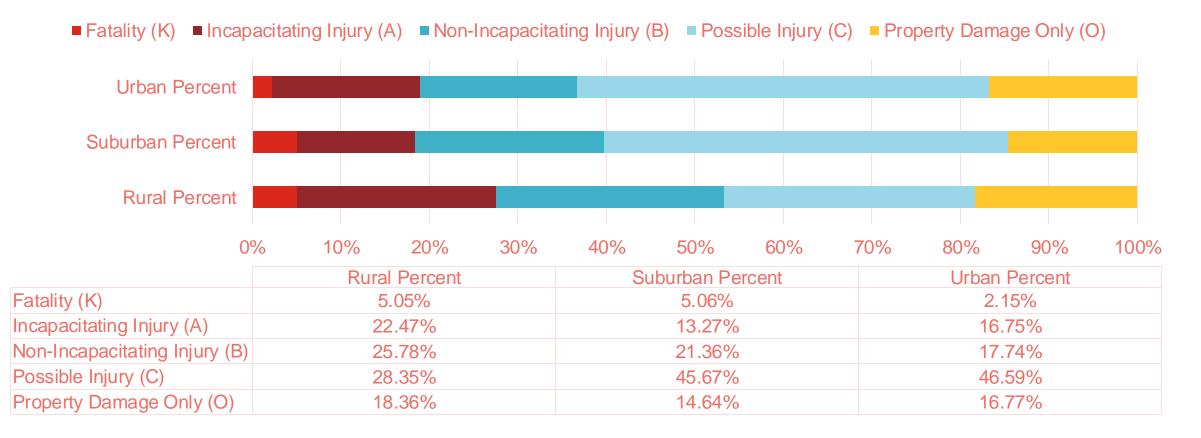
Bicycle and Pedestrian Crash Analysis

- Used <u>Safer Streets Priority Finder</u>





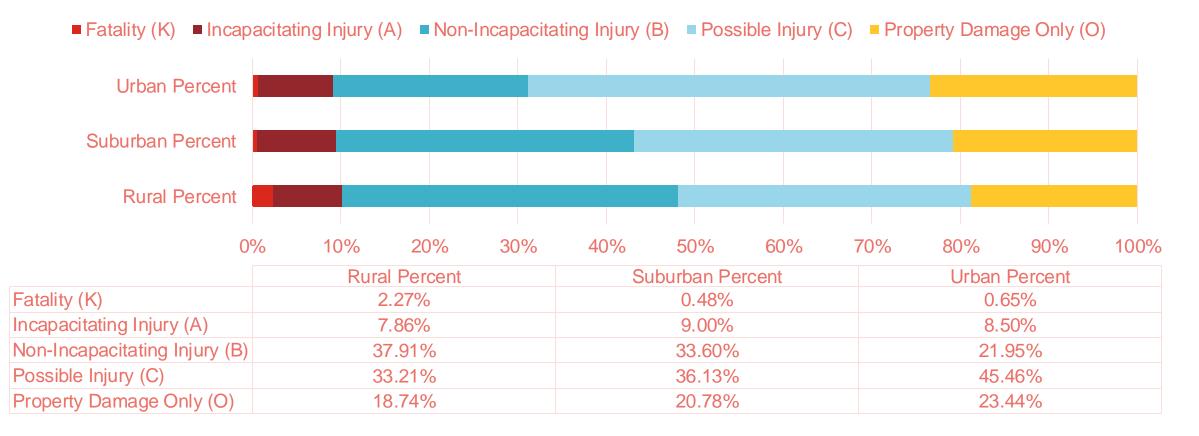
Pedestrian Crash Severity








Bicycle Crash Severity









Level of Traffic Stress

- Identifies bicycle facilities that are comfortable for all riders
- **Green** = low-stress
- **Red** = high-stress

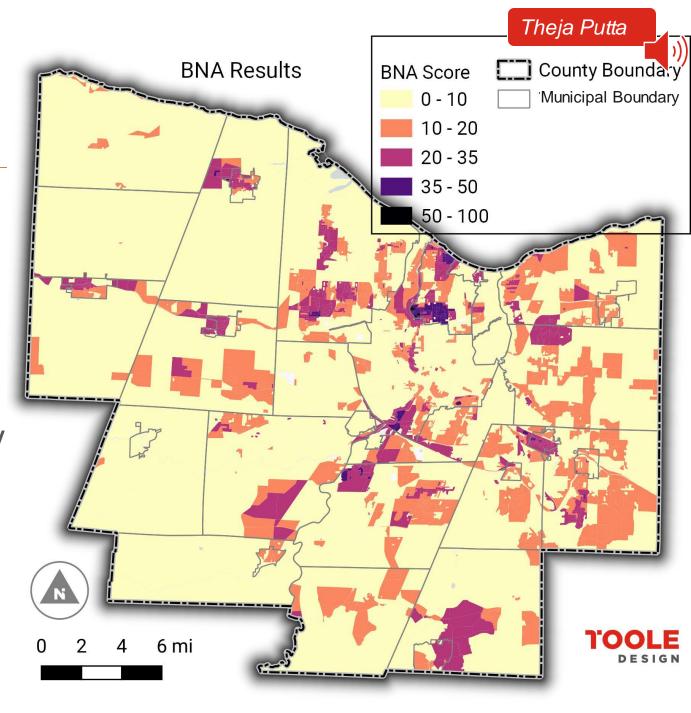




Bicycle Network Analysis

• Three main steps

- Level of Traffic Stress
- Block-to-block connectivity analysis
- Aggregation of destinations
- Black/Purple = high connectivity
- Tan = low connectivity



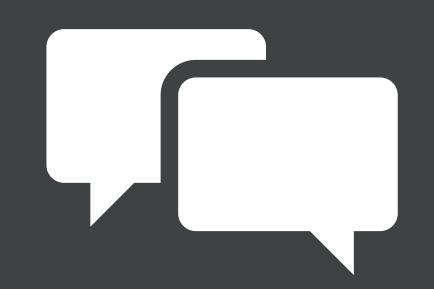

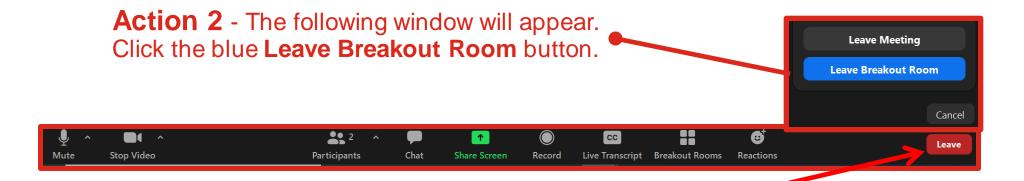
