Annual Agricultural District Additions

P. Gooch provided information for the annual agricultural additions through presentation and maps. The report included a list of ten (10) parcels from eight (8) landowners. The Board reviewed and considered each parcel individually.

- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by R. Pickering, and adopted to add parcel 204.02-1-20.11, Mendon, NY - (14.23 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by J. Smith, and adopted to add parcel 012.01-1-5.111, Hamlin, NY - (54.11 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District. Member B. Brightly abstained from the vote to reduce any appearance of a conflict of interest.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by M. DeMeyer, and adopted to add parcel 016.02-2-2.1, Parma, NY - (18.6 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by J. Haseler, and adopted to add parcel 031.03-1-10.112, Clarkson, NY – (10.1 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by R. Pickering, and adopted to add parcel 112.02-1-7.12, Sweden, NY – (70.50 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by M. Greene, and adopted to add parcel 141.01-1-48 and 141.01-1-14.1, Penfield, NY – (67.85 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by M. DeMeyer, and adopted to add parcel 057.01-2-21.4, Parma, NY – (39.23 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
- A motion was made by Legislator Colby, seconded by B. Brightly, to add parcels 034.01-1-41 and 034.01-1-43, Greece, NY – (4.28 acres) to the Monroe County Agricultural District. Motion failed. Zero voting in favor to add the above two referenced parcels to the Monroe County Agricultural District.
