Irondequoit

2590 Culver Road – Potential for storm water discharge from proposed apartment complex. Still working through the planning process.

NYSDEC – 115 Shore Drive permit transfer. Discussion regarding Newport Dock replacement status. Review has been delayed.

Penfield

LaSalle Landing Park – Proposals have been received for the comfort station/park development. Reviewing those and anticipating going to town board approval shortly.

NYSDEC – No updates for Penfield

Webster

Waterview at Willowpoint – Currently under review, 56-unit townhome development. The proposal includes building a dock.

282 Lake Road – Permit application related to installing a dock.

701 Summit Drive – Work being done in steep slope area. Issued stop work order. Working with property owner to come into compliance.

255 Lake Road – 2 Single family dwellings on same parcel. The property owner wants to tear down existing home and rebuild. Also looking to add on to other property. Will need to conference with DEC on some questions relative to this project.

224 Shorewood Drive – DEC issued CEHA Permit for retaining wall at the top of the bluff. Now under town review.

NYSDEC – Did have discussion with Stony Point Marina regarding trimming trees and vegetation and proper management/maintenance of those.

NYS DEC

Some discussion regarding changes to NYS DEC wetland determination. New review process that is submitted electronically for determination. May be up to 90-day lead time in order to receive an answer.

Harbor Management Plan Update
