

PARK HOURS:

GENERAL PARK RULES:

- Carry-in Carry-out rule:
 - which means you must take all your garbage with you for disposal after leaving the park.
- All pets must be leashed and you are responsible for cleaning up after them.

Please be aware of seasonal changes in trail conditions and be prepared for natural conditions such as mosquitoes and poison ivy in some areas.

Trails and Pathways are multiple use, unless noted otherwise. Enjoy walking, running, bicycling, horseback riding and crosscountry skiing.

HIGHLAND PARK

Highland park contains various botanical and floral collections including the Poet's Garden, a large number of Azaleas and Rhododendron, the famour Pansy Bed, numerous Evergreens, Magnolias and the nation's largest Lilac Collection.

WARNER CASTLE

Warner Castle and the Castle Garden's landscape were developed as residence for Horatio Gates Warner. The landscape was created by landscape architect, Alling DeForest. The structure and gardens were incorporated into Highland Park in 1951. Warner Castle is now the headquarters of the Rochester Civic Garden Center, a private, non-profit organization which functions as a public, horticulture education resource.

LAMBERTON CONSERVATORY

The Lamberton Conservatory is an indoor, year round plant and floral display. It includes a changing seasonal room, rain forst room, economic plants room, desert and houseplant rooms. There is also a lily pond and stream with goldfish. It is open daily. Call 753-7270 for more details.

IRIS FRIENDSHIP GARDEN

This garden was established as a sister cities participation and celebration of Pacific Flora 2004, an international horticulture exposition at Hamamatsu, Japan. The friendship garden features a collection of Louisiana Irises and companion plantings. The educational piece will be the inclusion of the five original species of Louisiana Irises (original parentage). The display bed will include a progression of hybridization of the Iris from species to the most recent cultivated varieties.
